1. Remediation

- a. This will continue to be stressed to students to encourage them to attend- this will help them get some guidance with tutoring, even if they do not have attendance issues.
- b. Please encourage students to take advantage of this availability- this takes precedence over other extra-curricular activities.
- c. Over the years, Dr. Tyson has noticed that this opportunity has immensely benefited current seniors that have taken advantage of this throughout their high school years.

2. Testing

- a. AP testing continues to go well. Teachers are aware of schedules for final exams.
- b. Exam dates and times (if students have an A in the course, students can exempt review but are still encouraged to attend their review. Exams run from 8:30am- 1:30pm):
 - Friday, June 3rd- 1st block exam, 2nd review
 - Monday, June 6th- 2nd block exam, 3rd review
 - Tuesday, June 7th- 3rd block exam, 4th review
 - Wednesday, June 8th- 4th block exam, back to 1st block
 - Thursday, June 9th- make up testing, graduation practice for seniors, normal school day
- c. Changes this year:

- For EOC's, we are working on finding more proctors to assist with testing.
- A few years back, schools had the opportunity to vote if they wanted to give the NC Final exam for certain core subjects. The language of the vote and test showed that the exams were used more to evaluate teachers and not students.
 - a. However, started fall of 2016, and following, every core four teacher will have to give the NC Final exam for all courses.
 - b. Change in testing for PSAT- now 10th graders (not 11th) will take this so they can get through Math II before taking the test.

3. End of year

- a. Summer school will be available starting June 15th
 - It will be a little different this summer in that not all classes are just for students making up credits. Now that we have more offerings with Union County Virtual and college courses online, students can come over the summer for these courses. Or, if students cannot fit certain classes in their regular schedule, they can use the summer to take classes that they may want to take.
 - Location: Media Center, working with Mrs. Helms and a distance lab coordinator. About 50% of the course has to be done on campus, but a majority of those in school requirements are assessments (quizzes, tests, etc.).
