

Central Academy Theatre

The Central Academy Theatre group is preparing their shows to take to the North Carolina Theatre Competition in a few weeks. The group put on their productions for the Central Academy community in order to gain feedback about the two shows. Rules of the NCTC competition include that the production can be no longer than 45minutes and this was great practice for the ensembles. After the two productions, Mr. Robinson, Theatre teacher and Director, led the audience and cast in a Talk Back session where the audience got to provide feedback to the casts and to Mr. Robinson.

The first production was entitled "Coming Attractions" and it is authored by Ted Tally, Jack Feldman, and

Bruce Sussman. It is a story about Lonnie who is a vicious person, but does not see himself as a sensation. A talent agent, however, does and begins to create a criminal persona for him to become. Lonnie finally agrees and goes door to door murdering people dressed as a skeleton. Sound scary? In real life it would be, but the show is actually a comedy about the situation and has some very funny moments. In the play, Lonnie is captured and becomes a tv celebrity for a short time. Wanting that celebrity status back, he disguises himself as a Miss America contestant and plans to kill Miss America on camera. But there is a twist as Lonnie falls in love with Miss America. But the talent agent even



capitalizes on this and turns Lonnie's ultimate price for his crimes into a prime time television production!!

The second production was entitled "The Parchman Hour". The Parchman Hour was written by Mike Wiley to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Freedom Riders. The play recreates the 1961 event when the 13 Freedom Riders board a bus that will travel through Mississippi and Alabama. Many other civil rights activists would follow this path and many were brutally attacked or arrested. The play describes the bus journey, the hatred that the Riders encountered, and the time they spent in a brutal prison, Parchman Farm. The Freedom Riders served their sentence rather than posting bail to show that the movement to desegregate interstate travel would not be stopped. The play relives their encounters as well as their attempt to pass time in prison. The activists sing songs, tell jokes, and even narrate time period commercials to pass the time. The singing and dancing is wonderful and the storyline is a must see.

On the weekend of September 20th through the 22nd, Forty NHS members volunteered at this years' annual MS bike race at the Central Academy of Technology and Arts. Between the forty students, each volunteered 3 to 5 hours of their time to help out with the Breakaway to the Beach. Their accumulative time devoted to the event was around 140 service hours. Some students arrived as early as 5 A.M. to help the cyclists prepare, unload, and sign in to start. The turnout was in the hundreds and the cyclists themselves raised over half a million dollars! This money will go to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society in order to research a cure for this debilitating autoimmune disease. The ride is over 200 miles long, takes two days, and stretches from Monroe to Sunset Beach, South Carolina.




School Safety Reminders

Pre-Engineering Corner


Digital electronics students are redesigning a fireplace control circuit for a residential gas fireplace. The fireplace burner is equipped with four thermal sensors. The sensors are connected to a fireplace control circuit and also to an emergency cutoff valve to keep the gas flowing. The original design of the fireplace control circuit was simple. For the gas valve to remain on all four sensors needed to output a logic one. During field testing it was discovered that variations in gas pressure and humidity caused the thermal sensors to occasionally output a logic zero even when a flame is present, this caused frequent unnecessary shutdowns and constant customer dissatisfaction. For the redesign students will design a circuit where the emergency cutoff valve will remain open as long as three of the four sensors indicate that a flame is present, additionally they have been asked to add a second output indicator to the



control circuit. This indicator will output a logic one when the four sensors do not all agree. This indicator will be used by the service technician to diagnose whether a faulty sensor exists.

To complete the process students will design a combinational logic circuit that meets the detailed design specifica-

tions. Students will use circuit design software, Boolean algebra, and Karnaugh mapping techniques. Additionally students must prepare a conclusion that includes all of their design work and their documentation should be complete enough that a student with a similar knowledge of digital electronics could reproduce their design without any additional assistance.
