

Students must be high school seniors and citizens of the United States, but do not need to be related to an Elks member. College Visits: Go on line and check the college web site for the visitation dates. You may visit three colleges a year; bring something back stating you were involved in a college visit, and the days are excused.

Senior Honor Awards' Opportunities

Seniors have the opportunity to be recognized at graduation for two UCPS honor programs. The first one is the North Carolina Academic Scholars Program and the second program is the UCPS Global Scholars Program. Both programs are similar in that students must meet the North Carolina graduation requirements and both award a special seal for the student's diploma, an honor cord, and recognition in the program at graduation.

With the NC Scholar's Program, students must have an over-all unweighted GPA of a 3.5. and take combinations of elective requirements including three extra honor or AP level courses in the student's junior and/or senior year.

To receive the Global Scholar's Award, the student must submit a proposal to the school's Graduation/Scholarship Committee outlining their plans for completing a Service Learning Project that will allow them to contribute to the local, national, or world community. The project must have a global theme and if approved, the student would present a written artifact to the committee. The student must also take a global awareness class and include two honor electives in recommended electives.

The specific requirements for each program can be found on page 17 and 18 in the UCPS Program of Studies.

On Thursday, November 21st, students from the Theatre Academy at CATA took the stage in Greensboro to perform *The Parchman Hour* at the NCTC State Finals. Playwright Mike Wiley was in attendance for the performance as well.

CATA was one of sixteen schools to perform at the state finals after they advanced from the regional competition earlier in November in Pinehurst. Porter Ridge High School also advanced to the state finals from a different regional competition.

At the judging on Friday, The Rimers of Eldritch, which was performed by Northwest School of the Arts, was the judge's choice for Distinguished Play and The Parchman Hour was the audience's choice for Distinguished Play.

Both plays will now represent North Carolina

at the Southeastern Theatre Conference in Mobile, Alabama the first week of March.

In addition to the Distinguished Play award, the performance also earned the following awards: Chapin Silberquit earned an Excellence in Projection Design; Elijah Inuwa and David Moberg earned an Excellence in Music Design; Nkeki Obi-Melekwe earned an Excellence in Acting award, and Samantha Jackson was named as the female recipient of the Outstanding Achievement in Acting award.

This is the second time in three years that CATA's production has advanced to the Southeastern Theatre Conference and last year's performance of *The Crane Wife* was runner up at the state competition.



At the end of the 2012-213 school year, the Globalization Committee held a Global Mural Contest. Students submitted designs to paint on the wall outside of the Guidance Office. Alex Alamos won that contest with a beautiful design which included famous buildings around the world. Alex started painting the mural over the summer and recently finished. He had some help throughout his endeavor. Kaylee Kirby, Camille Alvin and



Ms. Kopchick all pitched in at different times to help Alex with his mural. When asked why he chose the particular structures, Alex stated, "I wanted to choose awesome iconic buildings from all over the world and from different time periods. I chose the Burj Khalifa from Dubai as one of my buildings because it is currently the worlds tallest building and very modern. It was completed in 2010. The Great Pyramid of Giza was the tallest building when it was built around 2560 BC, and it held that record for over 3800 years. I chose the Eiffel tower because it also held the tallest building record when it was completed in 1889. The Parthenon in Athens, Greece has been very influential in modern architecture. I chose a Mayan pyramid built around 3000 years ago, because it is probably the most recognizable building in Latin America. Saint Basil's Cathedral in Moscow, built in the 1500s, has the interesting onion domes. It also marks the geometric center of Moscow. I chose the Sydney Opera House from Sydney, Australia, built in 1973, because it has a very unique design. Finally, the San Francisco bridge is a beautiful bridge and is located in the United States."







National Guard Armory Welcomes Transportation Academy

On Wednesday, November 20, 2013, the senior Transportation Academy classes took a fieldtrip to the Old Monroe Armory to learn more about the National Guard. The students had the opportunity to learn about a few of the weapons and vehicles that are used during conflicts. Two of the guns were the belt - fed automatic grenade launcher and a .50 caliber machine gun. These two guns are so powerful that the operators have to brace themselves against objects in whatever vehicle they are in. This is because of the extreme recoil produced by these weapons. Students also saw a few of the vehicles used in convovs. Students sat in humvees. They also went went into one of the tanks to look around and see how things worked. Students also looked at a ten wheel carrier.


The team will be meeting again on Wednesday, December 4, to celebrate quickly before we begin working on our Laird-Lewis event Jan 3 and 4.



School Safety Reminders

All visitors must enter through the front doors and sign in at the office.

Remind your children to NEVER open exterior doors and to get an adult if someone comes to an exterior door.

In November, all students and staff participated in an important safety drill—a lockdown drill. Students and staff practice procedures that would be used in the event there was an intruder in the school building. The Monroe Police Department joined with CATA Administrators in overseeing this practice. The Monroe Police Officers were very complimentary of our students and staff and the efficiency of our procedures.

Lockdown drills are one of many safety procedures that we follow. We also conduct Fire and Tornado drills. In addition, this year our staff and students have made a concerted effort to ensure that all exterior doors are locked and secure during the school day. All visitors are required to enter through the main entrance and enter the front office to check in.
