As of tomorrow, we will have five days of instruction and review before final exams in all courses. Remember that each 6 week grade counts for 25% of your final semester grade, and the final exam itself counts for 25% of the final semester grade. Students should take advantage of all tutoring and review opportunities with teachers. The final exam schedule and study tips are posted in each classroom and are on the last pages of the Cougar Chronicle this week. We will be starting with the 4th period exam on Monday 1/13, so be sure you check out the schedule. All students are required to stay for all exam reviews. ALL students are required to take their final exams during finals week, and on the days scheduled. The final exams from the state are rigorous and students must sit down to study for every final exam they have.

Processed waiver forms for students that were over on absences that were mailed home prior to break. If enough absences were waived through the process, the student has finished the process unless they accumulate more absences. If enough absences were not waived, then the student must complete all recovery hours documented on the waiver form. Recovery opportunities will occur after school and on Saturdays starting tomorrow. Questions about waived absences should be directed to your child's grade level administrator: 9th grade—Mr. Howard, 10th and 12th grade—Mr. Pusser, 11th grade—Ms. White.

We have a few athletic events this week and hope that you will come out to cheer on the Cougars!! Concessions will be open at all home events. - o student will be responsible for addressing and mailing the envelope containing their transcript
- o If you are applying to a N.C. college or university, please send your transcripts through the Transcript Manager on CFNC's website.

Thinking Ahead—Senior Honor Awards' Opportunities

Seniors have the opportunity to be recognized at graduation for two UCPS honor programs.

The first one is the North Carolina Academic Scholars Program and the second program is the UCPS Global Scholars Program. Both programs are similar in that students must meet the North Carolina graduation requirements and both award a special seal for the student's diploma, an honor cord, and recognition in the program at graduation.

With the NC Scholar's Program, students must have an over-all unweighted GPA of a 3.5. and take combinations of elective requirements including three extra honor or AP level courses in the student's junior and/or senior year.

To receive the Global Scholar's Award, the student must submit a proposal to the school's Graduation/Scholarship Committee outlining their plans for completing a Service Learning Project that will allow them to contribute to the local, national, or world community. The project must have a global theme and if approved, the student would present a written artifact to the committee. The student must also take a global awareness class and include two honor electives in recommended electives.

The specific requirements for each program can be found on page 17 and 18 in the UCPS Program of Studies.

ACT—All Juniors will take the ACT in March. This is a college readiness exam and can help students to gain entry into college and qualify for scholarships. Resources to help students prepare have been added to the Students Page of the CATA website.










Air Pollution Simulation

Earth Science students in Ms. Kopchick's classes participated in an Air Pollution Simulation earlier this semester. Students examined their personal actions and those of their family that contribute to air pollution. Students led an interactive simulation of their daily activities. For each activity they were able to visualize the amount of air pollution they put into their personal "air shed." Clear water was turned a dark green brown color to represent smog. Once the simulated day was done, the personal "air shed" was placed in a community "air shed" to demonstrate how quickly clean air becomes fouled. After the lab, small group discussions were held. Students talked about specific activities they can change to make less air pollution. William Potts said, "I would use less air conditioning and turn off lights when I don't need them." Other discussions involved how our consumer-driven society attempts to pressure us into buying more things. Some students considered giving up some of those things they felt they didn't need.





Conor Flood ex-

plained, "Our consumer society is trying to get us to buy things that are cheap and not very good, but they make them look good in commercials. The more we buy, the more emissions and waste is produced." Students learned many of their daily activities have the potential to produce air pollution, but there is also a way to act responsibly and minimize those activities to produce less air pollution.



School Reminders—All visitors must enter through the front doors and sign in at the office. Students coming to school tardy MUST enter through front doors only.

Remind your children to NEVER open exterior doors and to get an adult if someone comes to an exterior door.

In November, all students and staff participated in an important safety drill—a lockdown drill. Students and staff practice procedures that would be used in the event there was an intruder in the school building. The Monroe Police Department joined with CATA Administrators in overseeing this practice. The Monroe Police Officers were very complimentary of our students and staff and the efficiency of our procedures.

Lockdown drills are one of many safety procedures that we follow. We also conduct Fire and Tornado drills. In addition, this year our staff and students have made a concerted effort to ensure that all exterior doors are locked and secure during the school day. All visitors are required to enter through the main entrance and enter the front office to check in.

January 13 – January 17, 2014: All students must attend review sessions, exams, and regular school day. Failure to attend will be counted as additional absences. Trips will not be considered excused absences and the student will not be given a makeup exam. Only exams that are missed due to documented illness or court will be excused.

EVERY class will be given a comprehensive final exam that will count for 25% of the student's final grade. Students can significantly increase or decrease their semester average with their final exam. Students should utilize notes, study guides provided by the teacher, and other resources to prepare for the final exam. Teachers will provide review sessions as listed above. The review session for the 4th period exam will occur on Friday, January 10th during the last block of the day.

Central Academy expects students to display their learning with academic integrity. Per student code of conduct, any student that is "cheating" will earn a ZERO for that final exam. As final exams account for 25% of the cumulative grade, we are reminding students that cheating on a final exam will have serious ramifications to their grade.

ALL Cell phones will be collected from students prior to final exams each day. Students should turn phones off prior to collection. Phones will be returned to students at the end of the testing window (12:50). NO exceptions. If a student does not turn in their cell phone and is found with it during the test, it will be considered cheating.

There will be NO extra-curricular events after school during exam week. Afterschool activities may resume on Thursday 1/16. Note—Athletic practices can occur until 5:00 each day as needed.

Cougar Final Exam Tips

- Create a study calendar and stick to it
- Ask your teacher for a study guide and USE IT!!
- Use your notebook to guide you through a review of the course
- Attend all review sessions offered
- Go to tutoring for extra support
- Make a study group, assign each person a topic to reteach
- Make a study group and discuss each topic
- Have your parents ask you questions
- Use diagrams, graphs, pictures, and drawings in your textbook to serve as a talking point for you to review
- Make flashcards on your computer or phone to practice important vocabulary words
- Look at your scores from the semester and identify topics
 you struggled in ask your teacher or a friend for help
- Stay after school to study let an administrator know which days your study group needs to stay and study and we will make arrangements for you to stay to study
- Rewrite important points, the act of writing or typing helps
 some people remember specific information
- Create an acronym, or a funny saying, or song to remember specific information
- Draw a quick sketch to help with definitions or concepts
- Practice math problems
- What other suggestions can your class come up with?
