Afternoon Car Rider Pick-up

As we all know, dismissal in the afternoon can sometimes be hectic at is busy. Please abide by the safety procedures listed below:

- Pedestrians have the right of way and cars should stop to allow people to cross. We do ask that walkers stick to the sidewalk and crosswalk.
- If your child is not outside and you have to wait on your child to exit the building please pull along the right curb all the way up to the mailbox. Once cars move, if you are still waiting, please continue to pull up as far as you can filling in all available space.
- Inside lane (for quick brief stops for boarding) **please do not stop in the inside lane** unless your child is there ready to get in your vehicle. If they are not outside please make sure you remain along the right curb. We do not want both lanes blocked while parents wait for their child to exit the building.
- If cars are parked along the curb and are ready to pull out and you are in the inside lane, please allow cars to merge into the moving lane.
- In an effort to load up quickly and exit the traffic circle, it would be preferred if you did not have to get out and switch drivers in order to let the student drive.
- At no time should there by three lanes of cars, this causes a safety issue.

February is Black History Month

In 1926 Dr. Carter G. Woodson instituted the first week-long celebration to raise awareness of African Americans' contributions to history. Prior to this time, little information could be found regarding African American history. Important achievements were left out of history books, and there was a general misconception that African Americans had made little contribution to U.S. society or history. 50 years later, the week became a month, and today February is celebrated as African American History Month. The month of February was chosen because it celebrates the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, both of whom dramatically affected the lives of African Americans. Frederick Douglass (1817-1895) was a writer, lecturer, editor, and civil rights activist who escaped slavery at age 21 and went on to campaign for the abolition of slavery, establish a newspaper, and hold the office of Minister to Haiti. He was a major voice in the antislavery/civil rights movement of his time. Abraham Lincoln (born February 12, 1809), as the sixteenth president of the United States, issued the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, thereby declaring that all slaves within the Confederacy would be permanently free. Each year, the Association for the Study of African American Life and History, founded by Dr. Woodson, sets the theme for the month. (taken from DiversityCentral.com)

Parent access to grades through the Parent Portal on PowerSchool

Parent access to grades requires a new Username and Password. To obtain the information, parent or legal guardian must bring photo ID to CATA. Parents may pick up their username and password during regular office hours, from 7:30 am—5:00 pm.

Please remember that you must show a photo ID to get the username and password. We will also be asking you to verify contact information when you come in, so if you have any changes to emergency contacts, please bring them with you.

Tutoring Opportunities at CATA

Pilot for Credit by Demonstrated Mastery

The North Carolina State Board of Education is in the process of implementing a new program which will allow successful students to accelerate their learning. The Credit by Demonstrated Mastery (CDM) program is to be implemented during the 2014-2015 school year by the Department of Public Instruction. This program will afford students the opportunity to earn high school course credit by a demonstration of mastery in the course curriculum without requiring the student to complete classroom instruction for 135 hours of seat time.


The Department of Public Instruction has given permission for school districts to pilot portions of the program this school year with specific guidelines. Union County Public Schools requested permission to provide the CDM opportunity to **current students in grades 8 and 9**. Courses available for the CDM process will be English II, Biology, Math I and Microsoft PowerPoint Word.

All 9th graders at CATA will receive a letter on Monday, 2/10, that describes how to proceed. There are strict deadlines for the process, and those students interested must complete the application and **submit it to the Guidance Counselors by February 13th.**

CATA Safety Information about Drug and Alcohol Prevention

- At CATA students are taught about the dangers of drug use during their Health and PE class, usually taken in the 9th grade year.
- CATA also has a **student club**, **SADD**, that is devoted to preventing drug use.
- **Teachers** are able to refer any students that they think may be using drugs to either the School **Nurse or Guidance Counselors** for help.
- Drug use, possession, and distribution is against policy in all UCPS schools and results in severe school consequences, as well as being reported to law enforcement. Students may not be in possession of any drugs or alcohol on school property, including buses and other schools/locations where CATA/UCPS is participating in events.
- As a measure to keep drugs out of CATA, and all UCPS schools, the Union County Sherriff's Department, in conjunction with the School Resource Officers and Administration, will conduct random searches of areas on school property by using a trained Canine Unit. This can include classrooms, lockers, cars on the property, and student belongings.
- **Students with medications** should be sure that they have completed the proper forms with the School Nurse as students may not carry any medication without doctor and School Nurse approval. Failure to follow UCPS procedures does not relieve students of consequences.
