Williams Memorial Scholarship** - an \$800 scholarship that will be awarded to a senior of a UCPS employee; and **Billy Stegall Memorial Scholarship** - a \$500 scholarship that will be awarded to a UCPS senior. - **SECU Foundation's 'People Helping People' Scholarship**: Each NC high school will receive (1) four-year scholarship valued at \$10,000 (payable at \$1,250 per semester to attend one of the 16 constituent campuses of the UNC System. To be eligible, students must: 1). be a US Citizen and resident of NC; 2). plan to attend one of the 16 UNC-system schools; 3). have a minimum 2.5 GPA; and 4). have demonstrated leadership, excellence of character, integrity, and community involvement. Also, the student must not be a director, employee, or family member of an employee of the State Employees' Credit Union or the SECU Foundation. If you are interested, please pick up an interest form in the Guidance Office. The interest form, a detailed resume, and two letters of recommendation from organizations in which you have completed community service with must be given to Mrs. Cameron by the deadline. *Please note*: if you are planning to attend a North Carolina community college, you may be eligible for a \$5,000 scholarship. Please contact the Financial Aid office at the community college for more details. If you have any questions, please see Mrs. Cameron. **Deadline: April 10, 2014.**

Guidelines are as follows:

- o after the first 3 transcripts students will need to pay \$2 for each additional transcript
- o student will be handed an official transcript in a CATA envelope, upon receipt of the \$2 fee
- o student will be responsible for addressing and mailing the envelope containing their transcript
- o If you are applying to a N.C. college or university, please send your transcripts through the Transcript Manager on CFNC's website.

The Cougar Council PTSO will be awarding three \$500 scholarships to CATA seniors. The scholarship award is designed for graduating seniors possessing strong character, a demonstrated belief in service to the community, and academic evidence predicting success in college. To be eligible, the student must have a minimum GPA of 2.5, the student or parent must be a member of PTSO, and the student has applied to attend a community college or higher level of schooling. A completed application, resume, two letters of recommendation, and a one-page essay on the topic, "Why I should be awarded the Cougar Council PTSO Scholarship" should be submitted by the deadline. GUIDANCE INFORMATION

ACT—All Juniors will take the ACT on March 4th—Tuesday. This is a college readiness exam and can help students to gain entry into college and qualify for scholarships. Resources to help students prepare have been added to the Students Page of the CATA website.

Juniors planning to take the **SAT** this spring, and all Juniors that take the **ACT** in March at school, need to make sure they list four colleges in which they wish to send their scores to. The colleges can be schools you are just thinking about and schools you are definitely interested in. Either way, **entering those schools when you take the SAT / ACT is the only time your scores will be sent for free.** *The Guidance Office cannot send test scores to colleges!*

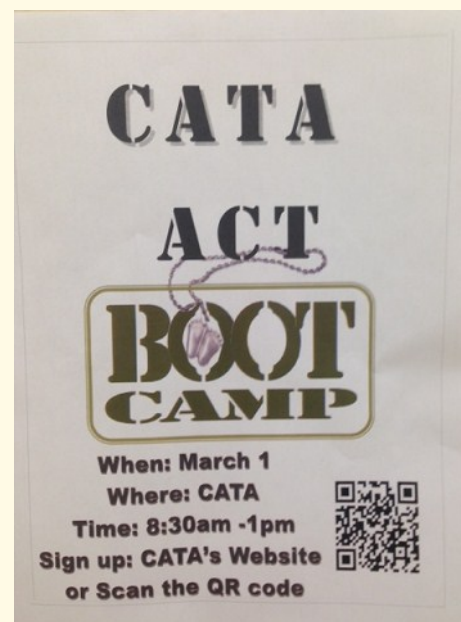

ACT—Boot Camp—Saturday March 1, 2014

All Juniors were invited to sign up for the First Annual ACT Boot Camp so that they would be prepared with strategies for the ACT that they take this Tuesday, March 4. The ACT is a required test in NC, and it is a test that colleges use when looking at admittance. Prior to the Boot Camp all Juniors were offered the opportunity to either sign up for several weeks of face to face instruction before/after school or to use online ACT resource books to prepare.

The Boot Camp was very successful and we hope to grow the program for next year!!



Central Academy - 2014-15 Registration Information

Parents and students - on February 28 guidance will have registration materials available on the CATA web site. This year we are spotlighting registration with video clips. While these videos are not worthy of an Oscar, we hope they will assist you in the registration process. Included on the web site is the registration forms and forms your student might need to participate in certain classes or programs. We hope by providing the information early, parents and students will have an opportunity to review classes and make decisions. You may print a registration form for your use; students will be given a hard copy of the registration form when they register. We must stress that this is your opportunity to choose classes and that you should pick classes that you will be happy with. Students will only have the opportunity to ask for class changes if they are missing a pre-requisite. The schedule will be created based on the requests from students—because of this schedule change requests will be very limited and students/parents should not expect to be able to change classes.

On March 12th students in second semester academy classes will meet with their academy counselor and register for 2014-15 classes. First semester academy classes will be registered by grade level and academies following the second semester registration. Students will be given their registration form during registration along with their transcript, and a registration card. Each student's registration card will be reviewed by the counselor for accuracy. Completed registration forms will be sent home with the student for the parent's review and record on the day they register. The registration schedule is posted on the guidance web site.

We encourage students to challenge themselves with their class choices, however, if a teacher does not recommend that you take an Honors level course, you will be signed up for the college preparatory level. If you still wish to take the higher level course, against your teachers' recommendations, your parent will be required to sign a waiver. We think AP courses are a great option for many students that want to challenge themselves with a college level course and we hope that many students will take advantage. AP teachers will be placing an AP video online for students to view so that they are aware of the rigor of the class. All students taking an AP course, and their parent, will be required to sign a contract stating that they understand the rigor and understand that they cannot change out of the AP class once the schedule is created.

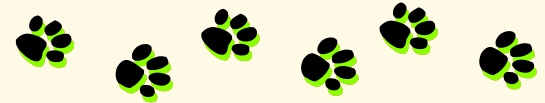

CATA involved in UCPS Google Symposium

Union County Public Schools was selected by Google representatives to host the esteemed Google Superintendent & Curriculum Leadership Symposium for our region on February 26th, 2014.

The purpose of the symposium was to provide a platform in which attendees could have access to information regarding best practices of educational technology integration and the opportunity to learn and discuss the necessary steps to take when implementing a 1:1 initiative in their district.

The morning began with a keynote delivered by Dr. Mary Ellis, UCPS Superintendent, and then participants attended various breakout sessions surrounding Leadership & Funding, Infrastructure, Deployment/Management, Principal Q & A Panel, Student Q & A Panel and Professional Development.

Sessions were delivered by Google, various members of the UCPS Cabinet Staff, Technology Services staff, principals at the middle and high school levels and students from the Central Academy of Technology & Arts. Students from Monroe High School's production class will assist in filming the event.

Students that presented to participated in the Google Symposium for the session called "Student Perspectives" include Turner Finnerty, Ansley Juan, Kyle Hrenyo, Eliza Rust, Lukas Duemmler, Lexi Rose, and Jake Hillhouse. Ms. Fisenne, Principal, Ms. Thompson, Instructional Technology Facilitator, and Mr. Simon, Technology Resource spoke at the session as well. Students were introduced and each student spoke about their perspective on how technology has impacted their learning. At the conclusion of the talks, attendees were able to ask students questions. Students did a wonderful job answering questions for the attendees.

After the morning sessions, students joined the participants for lunch and then acted as tour guides when the participants visited CATA to see technology in action. Attendees visited the classrooms of Dr. Gundersen (English), Ms. Craven (Band), Dr. Tarlton (English), and Ms. Morgan (Science) to see how the teachers and students use technology in the classroom.

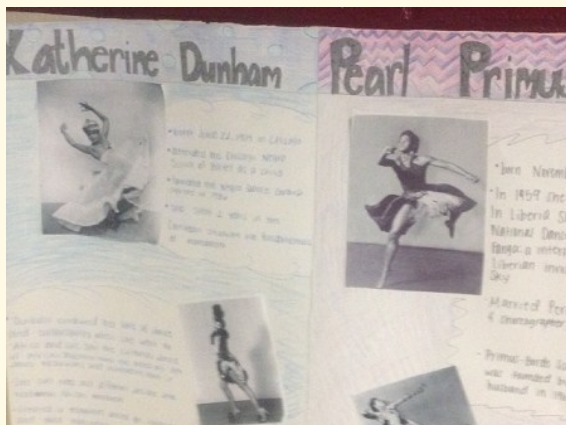

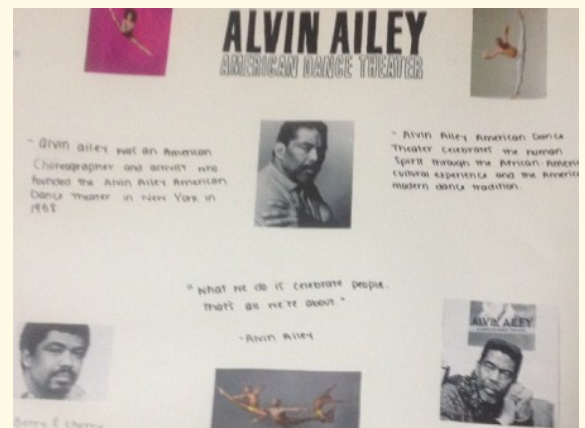
Snapshots of how some teachers incorporated Black History Month into classes:

AP US History– covered the Civil Rights Movement. Students discussed the major milestones in the Civil Rights Movement from the 1940s-1970s. Students were able to see the Parchman Hour and completed a brief research assignment based on one of the characters depicted. Students also read primary sources from both Civil Rights Reformers as well as Segregationists. The classes viewed a short documentary on the Birmingham Campaign as well. Students completed their studies by reading an article on the role of music in the Civil Rights Movement, listening to some samples of Civil Rights Music, and reflecting in a journal.

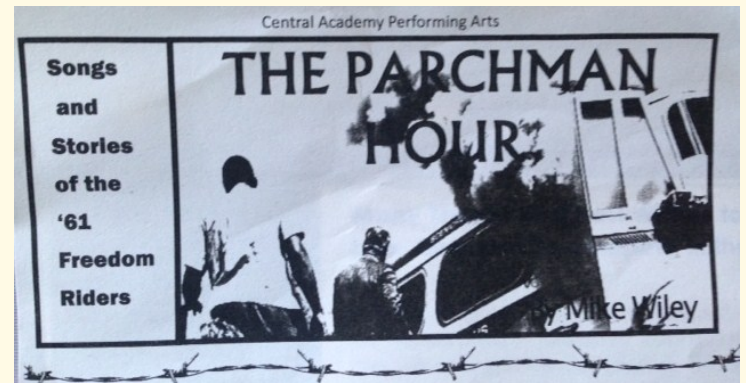
US History– Students studied the Abolitionist Movement. Students were able to look at Slave Rebellions and students did some research and discussed Slave Resistance and Escape. Students were finishing their studies last week discussing Causes of the Civil War and the role slavery played in leading to the Civil War.

Tutoring Opportunities at CATA

Teachers have the opportunity to offer both tutoring and enrichment to students that they select during Cougar Time. If you have a concern about your child's progress, feel free to contact your child's teacher to see when the best way for them to get additional support.

Parent access to grades through the Parent Portal on PowerSchool

Parent access to grades requires a new Username and Password. To obtain the information, parent or legal guardian must bring photo ID to CATA. Parents may pick up their username and password during regular office hours, from 7:30 am—5:00 pm.

Please remember that you must show a photo ID to get the username and password. We will also be asking you to verify contact information when you come in, so if you have any changes to emergency contacts, please bring them with you.
