Students will receive an updated schedule. Most schedules remain the same, others have had changes due to student request or the need to get academy or core classes to all students. Students must follow the schedule given to them on Monday morning. Advisors will explain the schedule change process to students on Monday morning.

To those parents that have been able to come in to sign the permission form for the **chromebooks**, your children will be able to pick up their laptop during lunch on Monday. All other students, we will be sending the form home with the student on Monday since we have been told that we can accept signatures without identification now. Students will go through a chromebook orientation on Friday afternoon. Students are required to bring the chromebooks to school every day. ALL Student Schedules

Small changes / additions in staffing resulted in small changes to the master schedule earlier this summer and ALL students will receive a new schedule when they return to school. Some students will be affected by the changes, others will not. Be sure to check out NEW Course Offerings on page 7!! You MUST follow your new schedule that you receive in advisory tomorrow morning. If you have a concern about your schedule you may email your counselor tomorrow after you have gone to your scheduled classes. Remember that the only students that will be allowed to go to the guidance office during the day will be students that have a hole in their schedule for the first semester. All other concerns should be relayed to the counselors via email.

Hall Passes ~Each teacher has 2 hall passes that students may use with teacher permission to go to the restroom or other destination. NO student may be in the halls during class time without a hall pass.

Student Parking Lot —NO student will be allowed to their car during the day unless escorted by an Administrator or School Resource Officer. If it is an emergency that a student go to their car, they will need to come to the main office.

ALL seniors should be sure to login to their **CFNC account** before they come back to school. If you cannot remember your account information, be sure to create a new account as you will need that.

Senior Pictures: Students had the opportunity to have senior pictures taken over the summer. If you did not get this done, plan on having your picture taken at CATA on 9/18.

Senior Graduation Packages: Senior orders for robes and other graduation materials will be taken on September 18th. Please be sure to watch for more information.

Senior Activities: Student Council will be working with Administration on designing some senior activities during the school year. Please work with your Student Council Representatives if you have ideas.

Senior Advice: This year will be very busy planning and applying for colleges, getting a job, working on classes, and enjoying your last year in high school. Plan out all that you need to do so that you have time to relax and spend the appropriate amount of time on items on your To Do list. Feel overwhelmed? Don't keep it inside and assume it will get better. Come and talk to your guidance counselor or administrator so that we can help you plan out what you need to get done. You are not alone. We are here to help you.

College Recommendations: Please be respectful with the time frame that you ask staff to complete recommendations for you. Teachers can limit the number of recommendations that they write, so please ask teachers early for recommendations. Be sure to provide staff with a minimum of 3—4 weeks time to complete a recommendation for you. Remember that it is your responsibility to meet deadlines, teachers cannot put aside their teaching or family responsibilities because you neglected to ask them in advance.

Niessner and the SignUp Genius that our parents have set up for this purpose. Talk to Mr. Niessner or your team parent about how to get signed up today!!







Lead Athletic Director Doug Jones. Elijah's parents were also there for this recognition.



We are very excited for all of our CATA students to receive their Chrome book that they may use for schoolwork during the school year. This is an amazing initiative that students in UCPS will benefit from. Students will be required to bring their chrome book to school every day.



Parents—both you and your child will be required to sign a Chrome book Student /Parent Agreement. We may now accept your signatures without identification. We will get student signatures when they return to school and then forms will be brought home to you by your child to get your signature. Students will not be able to receive a chrome book when they are distributed during lunches the first few days of school unless the form is signed.

You will receive a letter explaining the initiative as well as a new \$25 user fee for your student. The letter will explain the many important services and parts that this fee will help to cover. Please read the letter when it comes home and send your payment in. You may begin to pay now if you would like, by check in the main office, by check given to your child's teacher, or online on the CATA website, under Parents & Community, then under On-line school payments.

We ask that each family submit payments by the end of September. Families of students that have qualified for the free lunch program will not have to pay the user fee.

Club Officers—Be sure to send a representative to the Club Leadership Council. If you cannot attend, please send your meeting dates and times to your club advisor





New Family Information for Central Academy of Technology and Art

- School day hours: 8:50-3:30 (Class starts at 8:50, students should all **arrive by 8:40** when the first bell rings to move to class.) If you are dropping your student off by car, you should arrive between 8:20—8:30 to ensure that your child can get to class on time.
- Lunches are determined by your 3rd block teacher, (there are four lunches).
- All students will receive their class schedules in home room on the first day of school.
- Upon arrival on the first day of school, all students will report to advisory first. Advisory assignments will be posted at the front of the school.
- Freshmen students will receive bus letters and assignments during Freshmen orientation.
- Bus letters and routes were mailed out to all students.
- Set uniforms are not required for PE classes, but a dress code is strictly enforced. This
 will be discussed during the first day of class. Sneakers, athletic shorts, and t-shirt are
 required every day.
- Lockers are not required, but you may rent a locker for \$2.00. PE Lockers are required. Your PE teacher will provide information on rental fee. NO students may leave their belongings out in the PE locker room. Athletes may also use a locker after school to lock up valuables. Please see your coach.
- Athletes may store their sports bags in the Varsity locker room each morning if needed. This will be locked by 8:40, so be sure to get there early. No one will be permitted in during the day.
- There is not a supply list. Supplies needed are on a class by class basis and each teacher will communicate this on the first day of school.
- Attendance is taken during each class, and it is vital that you are present at school every day. If you must make doctor appointments during the school day, be sure to do so at different times of the day so you don't miss too many days in one class.
- If you should be late to class over 15 minutes, you will be counted absent for the class, even though you may be there the rest of the period.
- Attendance matters for participation in extracurricular activities, and affects eligibility for sports. Students too sick to come to school should not be on school grounds for extracurricular events that day.
- Every teacher will have a Moodle page for students and parents to access with course information.
- Students will all receive an email account that they can use for their googlechrome books. It will be able to email other people in the UCPS network only.
