Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.

Be Smart. Don't text and drive. No text message is worth a life.



Junior College to Do List

Continue looking at colleges- /visit, visit, visit

- Does it offer your major
- Is it the right size for you
- Consider the location distance from home, weather, campus appearance
- Visit colleges-you get 3 lawful excused absences, check school web site for the junior s visitation dates; colleges usually have junior visitation events in the spring
- Can you afford the school

Take the college entrance exam

- Take the exam in the spring of this year
- Take the SAT and ACT once (the school will test the ACT in March)
- Take your second test from the test you scored highest on
- Register for test online-if you are on free or reduced lunch, see your guidance counselor for a fee waiver
- DO NOT begin your senior year without a SAT test

Bring up your GPA

- Colleges look at your final junior GPA for entrance so this is the last year to bring up your GPA
- Colleges look at the classes and grades you have made in your 9th, 10th, and 11th grade **Scholarships**
- You should already be looking for scholarships
- First look for them on the college web site where you plan to attend (type scholarships in search engine)
- Second open scholarship search accounts (you can find links on the CATA web site under school counseling tab then click on scholarships)

Create a resume

- An example of a resume' is on the CATA web site under the tab school counseling or you can go to Word and use a template.
- Your resume' should include extracurricular activities (in and outside of school,) you should include any honors you have received, list leadership, and give detailed information concerning community service.
- You report on grades 9-12

Athletes

- Register with the NCAA Clearinghouse (find it online)
- If you are on reduced/free lunch, the registration fee can be waived. See Ms. Tweed in guidance to have the fee waived.


