
















The most important benthat your student has the opportunity to take a college entrance exam for leges and universities throughout the country will accept an ACT score (previously some colleges and universities only would accept the SAT but that is no longer the case). The second benefit is that students will be able to list four colleges or universities to send the score directly to - this is also FREE! The third and final benefit is that your student could <u>potentially earn scholarships to college</u>!!!!! If they score within the high range (28 to 32) they could earn a full scholarship to many colleges and universities throughout the country. It is also possible to earn in-state tuition to surrounding state colleges or universities - for example The University of South Carolina and Clemson!!! Please take time to communicate with your 11th grade student the importance of the ACT!! Community Colleges also use the ACT score, as well as potential employers.
