Catalyst Conference

The Catalyst Conference at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill invites high school freshman, sophomores, and juniors to apply for a three day exploration of social justice issues affecting American youth. Catalyst creates an open environment for students form many different backgrounds to engage each other in challenging issues that affect the social fabric of our society. During the weekend, the 100 students selected to attend will engage with UNC-Chapel Hill student leaders who are working at the forefront of social issues in North Carolina. Students will participate in workshops related to Gender, Racial, and Socioeconomic Equality; Educational Disparity; Immigration status; Sexual Orientation; and other issues. These workshops will focus on the way these issues affect students in both urban and rural North Carolina, as well as the larger society.



Play Me a Story

Musicians in the CATA Symphonic Band and theater students from CATA presented a cross curricular performance for third and fourth graders from Benton Heights on Thursday, October 24 in the CATA auditorium. The program, titled "Play Me A Story," shed light on how composers use music to portray literary elements such as theme, plot, characterization, mood, setting, conflict, and foreshadowing. The featured musical selections in "Play Me A Story" drew from mysterious, spooky, and magical literature across the following genres: poetry, short stories, folklore, and mythology.

Didactic in nature, student actors in the performance served as tour guides through the music, highlighting connections between the elements of music and literature for students in the audience. Theater students brought characters to life on stage so that



prompt the musicians to play musical excerpts as examples of how music portrays character, plot, mood, and setting. Each miniature lesson was followed by a complete performance of the piece that portrayed the character's story.

At the conclusion of the performance, musicians and actors joined students in the audience for a question and answer session about the performance. Participants, young and old, thoroughly enjoyed being part of this project and look forward to more collaborative curriculum based performances in the future.

Book Spine Poetry Shows Collaboration between English Classes and Media Center

Students in Ms. Foreman & Dr. Tarlton's English II Honors class have been studying poetry and poetry analysis in preparation for the North Carolina English II End of Course Test. In an effort to get students out of their seats to understand what poetry is all about. Along with the efforts of Ms. Christensen, students



were taught about Book Spine Poetry. This is where you take the titles of books and lay them to where when you read the

spines it becomes a poem. Students were very creative and were challenged only to use specific sections of the Media Center to make their poems. After concluding the activity, the students discussed why this helped them become more acquainted with the thought process of poetry, and it was amazing to see that the students really went deep with their discussion and how it could help them understand the different types of questions that they may be asked to answer on the EOC. This was one of the most valuable learning experiences that has ever been witnessed.

CATA Symphonic Band Performs Annual Spooky Fall Concert

Students in the CATA Symphonic Band performed their annual spooky fall concert on Tuesday, October 21 in the CATA auditorium. This year's concert, titled *Diabolique*, featured dark, mysterious, and spooky music by composers such as Brian Balmages, David Holsinger, and Michael Sweeney. The concert program featured some of the most demanding technical literature the CATA musicians have performed in recent years, which is a testament to the growing ability level and increasing depth of the band program here at CA-TA.

Student musicians dedicated one of

the pieces on the program to former band director Mr. Jim Hill who was in the audience on Tuesday night. The piece, titled *Prelude and Pursuit, was commissioned by the Union County Bandmasters Association in*

2012 and debuted by the Union County Honor Band that same year. Mr. Hill worked closely with Michael Sweeney, the composer of the work, and the piece is inspired by Mr. Hill's decorated career as a music educator in Union County.

Important Info for all JUNIORS and Parents!!!! The ACT will be given to all juniors FREE on March 3rd, 2015! Preparing and doing well on the ACT will have long term benefits. The most important benthat your student has the opportunity to take a college entrance exam for leges and universities throughout the country will accept an ACT score (previously some colleges and universities only would accept the SAT but that is no longer the case). The second benefit is that students will be able to list four colleges or universities to send the score directly to - this is also FREE! The third and final benefit is that your student could potentially earn scholarships to college!!!!! If they score within the high range (28 to 32) they could earn a full scholarship to many colleges and universities throughout the country. It is also possible to earn in-state tuition to surrounding state colleges or universities - for example The University of South Carolina and Clemson!!! Please take time to communicate with your 11th grade student the importance of the ACT!! Community Colleges also use the ACT score, as well as potential employers.
