
The CATA auditorium was filled with students from both schools, and the remainder of students watched in their classrooms. Student questions were excellent and showed that they

Selma Speech & Essay Contest

Who Can Participate?

The National Liberty Museum's *Selma* Speech & Essay Contest is open to US High School students ages 14-18 (as of the Feb. 15 deadline), who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States and its territories. After viewing Paramount Pictures film SELMA, contestants will respond to the Contest topic with an original 500-700 word essay and videotaped speech reading of their essay. It all started with a speech:

At the age of 15, a young Martin Luther King, Jr. entered a high school public speaking competition with his submission called, "The Negro and the Constitution." He was in his junior year, and he won the competition. On the bus ride home, young King and his three companions were told to give up their seats to a white couple who had just boarded the bus, and they stood for several hours on their way back to Atlanta.

It has been widely written that the high school speech Dr. King wrote inspired his "I Have a Dream" oration, since all of the concepts in his competition submission were encapsulated into the historic 1963 speech. There are striking parallels between the two writings. That is the power of words.

Selma Speech & Essay Contest Topic:

"The movie *Selma* tells the story of how Martin Luther King, Jr. and others peacefully protested to advance voting rights. What do you think needs to be done today to protect individual freedom and self-determination? What are you doing or will you do to peacefully advance those rights?"

The ACT will be given to all juniors **FREE** on **March 3rd**, **2015**! Preparing and doing well on the ACT will have <u>long term benefits</u>. The most important benefit is that your student has the <u>opportunity to take a college entrance exam for free</u>. All colleges and universities throughout the country will <u>accept an ACT score</u> (previously some colleges and universities only would accept the SAT but that is no longer the case). The second benefit is that students will be able to list <u>four colleges or universities to send the score directly to - this is also FREE</u>! The third and final benefit is that your student could <u>potentially earn scholarships to college!!!!!</u> If they score within the high range (28 to 32) they could earn a full scholarship to many colleges and universities throughout the country. It is also possible to earn instate tuition to surrounding state colleges or universities - for example The University of South Carolina and Clemson!!! **Please take time to communicate with your 11th grade student the importance of the ACT!!** Community Colleges also use the ACT score, as well as potential employers.

Steps to Creating Your Aurasma Video:

- Create a video using the following supported formats: mp4 and flv files recommended but .mov, .wmv, mpg1 and mpg2 are supported
- You may do this directly on you smart phone. You may also come into the school and have a yearbook staff member make your video with you.
- The video cannot be more than 75 meg. Although if you use the mp4 or flv files, this should provide a decent sized video.
