Final exams begin next week, please see the final exam schedule in the chronicle. All CTE 3rd and 4th period classes will take one part of their final exam on Wednesday June 3rd. We will have an altered schedule on that day that will affect ALL students—students are expected to familiarize themselves with the schedule. There is important information about final exam week expectations in the chronicle. Last chance for yearbook—if we can get up to an additional 25 orders we can order one more round of yearbooks. If you would like to get one, email Ms. Lisa Eaton or bring your \$80 in to the office tomorrow. Last chance.

End of the Year reminders are in the chronicle as well. Chromebooks are needed for exam days and students should plan on charging them overnight to be ready. ALL students must return their chromebook AND charger on the day of their last exam to avoid being charged. Attendance Waivers are past due—please get them in tomorrow at the latest. There are recovery options available each day and we have many students fixing their attendance, however, some students are not making up their days. Please remember that students can fail a course due to attendance. Report Cards will be available IN the CATA main office starting on Friday June 12th. Please remember that you can also see final grades through your parent portal. All student medications should be picked up in the nurse's office by Friday June 12th. We are not permitted to retain these at school and they will be discarded if not picked up.

# **Remembering the Holocaust**

As years pass, the Holocaust seems to become a harder subject to teach. Why? Students are as familiar with it as past generations, and as with any historical event, the further removed we are from it, the less we remember. That is why I have made it my mission and goal to teach the Holocaust and keep the memories alive. Over 70 years have passed since the beginning of the tragic events of the world's most horrendous genocide. While teaching the novel *Night* it becomes more apparent every time that these students have a valued interest in this subject. The novel encompasses one man's story of survival through the depiction of suffering, starvation, and eventual death, and yet it is a story of triumph and hope. Paired with Ms. Barron, Ms.



Janicki, and Ms. Foreman, we took our students to the Jewish Community Center of Charlotte (JCC). Students had the opportunity to hear firsthand accounts of survival, participate in various workshops, and communicate their feelings about hatred and bullying in their lives today. When we returned, I knew I wanted to do this project again. Every semester, I just do not think that the students are going to surpass what has been done before them, and every time I am amazed at the amount of work and consideration that has been put into this project. As we are wrapping up this project, we are inviting you, the CATA community to come view this project. #### **Final Exam Information**

Final Exams are to be given on the dates listed on the schedule. NO final exams may be taken early. If a student is absent due to illness they may make up the exam on Wednesday 6/10 at 8:40 am. This is our make up day. Parents should contact the guidance office to make arrangements. Vacations and college visits are not a reason to miss an exam. The final exam will be scored as a zero. If you have questions, call your counselor or grade level administrator.

Review Sessions—ALL students are expected to attend the review session for their exam.

**Score Results:** All high school exams count 25% of a student's grade for the semester. Please emphasize this point to students and help them to recognize the opportunity of a positive outcome and the consequence of a negative one.

**Exam Review:** All teachers are expected to help students with review during class time and to distribute a review /study guide to students prior to testing. If your child has not received one, please check with your child's teacher.

**Academic Integrity**: The penalty for cheating of any kind is a "0" on a final exam.

**Cell Phones and Technology:** Students will be required to turn in cell phones during testing sessions, and it is our strong recommendation that they are not brought to school on these days. Students should bring their chromebooks to school each day as many tests are given on the chromebooks AND many teachers will be using the chromebooks for activities after the exam.

CALCULATORS—ALL calculators that have been borrowed from the CATA media center are DUE back Monday June 1st to your math teacher or directly to the media center. ALL calculators will be used for testing in math. Students using their own calculators will be required to turn them in to their math teacher during their review period. Teachers will CLEAR all calculators, this includes programs and apps on them.
