Vision:

Third-grade students will increase overall reading proficiency from 26.9% to 45% by the end of the 2023-2024 school year, fourth-grade will increase from 51.8% to 65%, and fifth-grade will increase from 40.6% to 55%. Overall grade level proficiency for third through fifth grades is 55%. (A1.05, A4.16, A2.13, A3.04)

Marshville Elementary students will increase fourth-grade math proficiency from 63% to 75% as evidenced by end-of-grade tests from 2023-2024. Thirdgrade will increase from 69% to 80%, while fifth-grade improves from 66% to 75%. Overall grade level proficiency for third through fifth grades is 78%. (A1.05, A4.16, A2.13, A3.04)

School discipline office referrals will decrease by at least 20% to 370 by the end of the 2023-2024 school year as shown by PowerSchool discipline referral data (E1.01, A4.06)
