A few things to remember about SAT/ACT testing:

If you are planning on applying to a four-year college or university it is a good idea to take either the ACT or the SAT at least two times.

You do NOT (and should not) wait until your scores come in to apply to colleges.

You do NOT need to take the SAT or ACT if you are only applying to community colleges.

Amount: Up to \$2500

Criteria: Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a career or technical program (up to 2 years) at an accredited non-profit post-secondary institution in the United States, demonstrated critical financial need (must be eligible to receive the Federal Pell grant as determined by completion of the FAFSA), demonstrated perseverance in overcoming adversity, and be a United States citizen. Funds may be used for tuition, fees, books and supplies.
