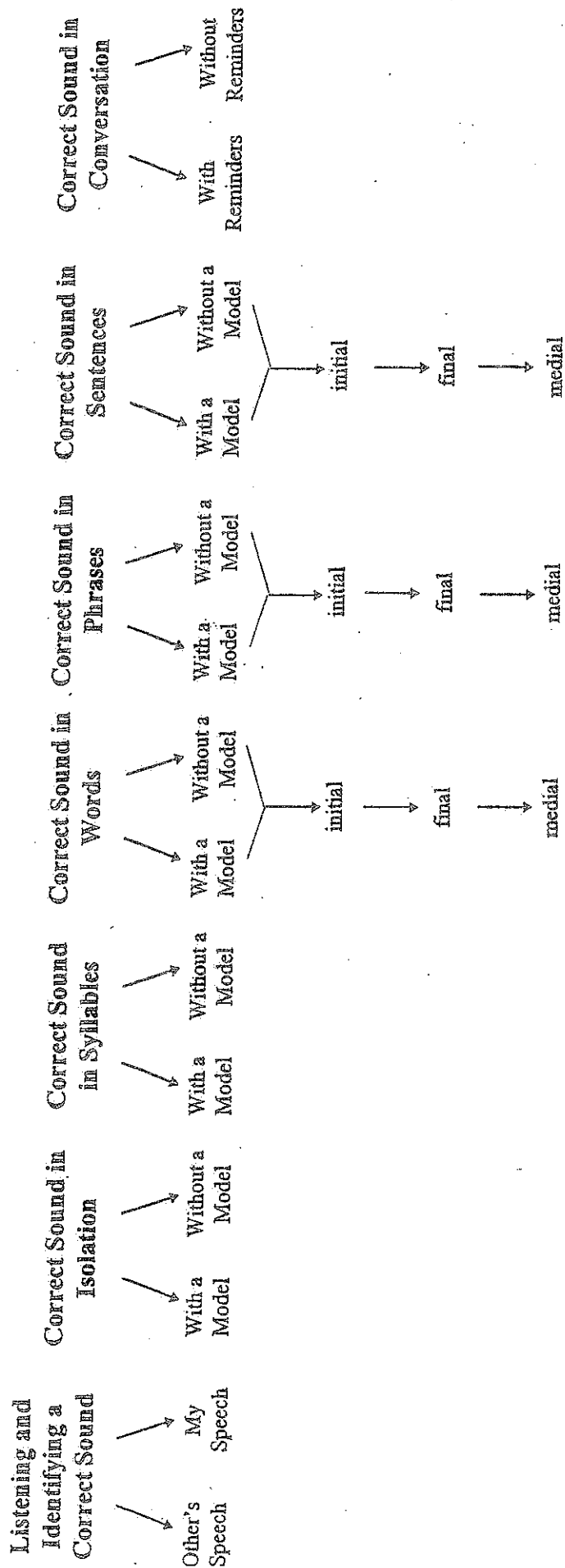

LISTENING AND IDENTIFYING CORRECT SOUNDS



Articulation Therapy Hierarchy of Skills Introduced and Taught

Teach how to correctly make the targeted sound in isolation

Auditory Discrimination Tasks- Make sure the child hears and understands the difference between the correct way to produce the sound, and their sound error

Syllable level- Targeted sound plus a vowel (sa, see, so, say) - with and without a model

Initial word level- (soap, see, sock) – with and without a model

Initial phrase level- (i see you, yellow soap, big sun) - with and without a model

Initial sentence level- (I see a crayon on a table. The yellow sun is in the sky.) – with and without a model

Carryover and Generalization Work In Initial Position

Syllable level- vowel plus targeted sound (as, oss, ais, ees) - with and without a model

Final word level- (boss, mess, base) – with and without a model

Final phrase level- (mean boss, make a mess, on the base) – with and without a model

Final sentence level- (Mr. Owen is a mean boss. The baby made a big mess.) – with and without a model

Carryover and Generalization Work In Final Position

Syllable level- vowel plus targeted sound plus vowel(asa, ossee, aisa, eesa) - with and without a model

Medial word level- (bossy, messy) – with and without a model

Medial phrase level- (bossy man, messy baby) – with and without a model

Medial sentence level- (Mr. Smith is a bossy man. The messy baby spilled its milk.)
– with and without a model

Carryover and Generalization Work In Medial Position

Activities to Promote Generalization After Student Has Mastered Target Sound At Word, Phrase, and Sentence Level With And Without A Model:

- A "Speech Tracking Incentive Chart" has been included for you and your child to have a visual reference to look at how much you are working on improving their speech on a daily basis and how well they are doing. I have developed the chart to target the current speech sounds that they are able to produce with you at a structured syllable, word, phrase, and sentence level, but are not yet generalizing into everyday conversation. Remember, the skill of generalization is a skill that cannot be taught in isolated speech "practice" sessions, but rather will develop with consistent cueing and correction in their typical speaking environments, which are home and classroom. Your child needs to now be reinforced and rewarded in home and classroom environments for attempting to use these speech skills they have learned. I have listed 5 particular activities that you should be encouraging and expecting your child/student to participate in daily. If not all 5, at least 3 of these opportunities. If your child/student does well and produces the targeted speech sound in the designated activity 80% or more of the time, you should write an "A" above the dotted line for that particular day next to the designated activity. At the end of the day, if your child/student has three "A's" above the dotted line, they should color in the "smiley face" at the bottom of the day and be rewarded. You and your child's teacher should come up with the most motivating reward that is reasonable of course. Perhaps at the end of the week if they

have 4 "smiley faces" they earn something or a privilege as well. I have created this because without you and your child's teacher working on this daily, your child will not use the skills they have learned during the speech home program with you.

- 1.) Continue practicing the home program worksheets that have been sent home only if your child is struggling still to produce the sound. If they easily and quickly can repeat sentences or words, then they no longer need to be working on worksheets. Repeating sentences they are already good at is as non-beneficial as lifting a 5 pound weight for a work-out when you already know you can lift much more! If they can produce the targeted sounds in words, phrases, and sentences with and without a model, start working on carryover skills and stop with the worksheets!
- 2.) Start by choosing two consistent time periods during the day (car ride to school, dinner table, drive to boy scouts etc..) where your child knows that you will be listening and correcting their targeted sounds. As they show mastery at two time periods during the day, add more time periods during the day where they know you are listening and correcting. Be consistent!! They will only care about correcting it usually as much as the parent is consistent in correcting them 😊
- 3.) Start having them read their reading homework out loud, focusing on producing correct sounds. Monitor them. Have positive incentives.
- 4.) Communicate with other adults that work or are with your child (teachers, scout leaders, coaches, babysitters, day care providers). Make these people part of the incentive system and have them "report" on student's speech at the end of their time period. This will help your child learn that during all times and activities we want them to use good speech sounds.
- 5.) Play games with your children that requires a lot of talking or question asking (i.e Go Fish, Old Maid, etc...) Tell your child that why you are playing the game you are going be listening for the targeted speech sounds and "grading them" on how well they do.

6.) Do the carryover activities in your child's home program packet, and come up with creative ideas similar to those in the packet for additional work.
