## **School Report Card Grades**

School Report Card Grades—State has created the 15 point scale below to determine where each school stands in their overall performance. The point scale is based on the overall proficiency and growth of our school.

A = 85-100

B = 69-84

C = 53-68

D = 31-52

F = 31 and below

80 % of our score is based on proficiency (Proficiency is based on EOG scores in reading, math, and science; levels 4 and 5 are considered proficient)

20% is based on growth

According to last year's EOG data, our school met growth. Thinking about how this score is calculated, we will most likely place at a 'D' or 'F'.

Next Steps –Have a PR campaign to increase positive feelings in our community about where our school stands. Communicate school improvement plan and the work we have already begun since we reviewed our 2013-2014 data.
