Agenda Items

Cafeteria

- music on, teachers must reinforce quiet, --5th grade concerns
 - If the music is not on, it is okay to turn it on.
 - Mr. Pascarella will see if he can work the music to go through the speakers.
 - Mr. Pascarella, Mrs. Shulman, and Mr. Wieland will also try to make a new CD. We will try to do instrumentals. 3 different discs if possible so we can change it up.
 - We need to make sure that the students and the adults need to be quiet during the music. Holding us ALL accountable.
 - The music will be on for 3 minutes for eating purposes. Then we will have 7 minutes with it off. Just make sure the noise level doesn't get out of control even when they are allowed to talk.
 - Peanut free students should have a different role in the cafeteria and not wiping the tables.
 - Students sitting at the peanut free table that have a guest must have a school bought lunch to ensure that it is peanut free.

School Growth—appropriate size —Ms. Richardson

- They are looking at expanding the school sizes. Possibly more bathrooms, classrooms, cafeterias, etc.
- Will there be the staff to support the numbers that are larger?
- We are thinking that elementary schools should have a capacity of about 700 for Title One and about 1000 for non-Title One schools.
- For middle school the capacity should be about 1,600.
- For high school the capacity should be about 2,200.
