Math

Goal: By June 2018, 85% of our third, fourth, and fifth graders will be proficient in mathematics.

Reading

Goal: By June 2018, 70% of our third, fourth, and fifth graders will be proficient in reading according to North Carolina State Standards, based on EOG scores.

Strategies:

- Tutors/interventionists will collaborate with teachers and work with below grade level students in various reading strategies that follow: CAFE model, meta-cognition strategies and working within their text band to become proficient in that reading level before moving forward.
- Small groups and conferences: Target students' individual needs and group needs. With the use of Jennifer Serravallo's Strategies book, teachers scaffold students' skills and goals.
- Independent reading time students will engage in independent thinking and journaling that respond to Gravity Goldberg's philosophy. All teachers will benefit from a two day workshop with her in November.
- R4 supports our school's philosophy in spiraling to ensure students are exposed to a continuous variety of content daily.
- Teachers will provide anchor support with objective and by statements during each mini-lesson along with modeling and utilizing social and language goals throughout reader's workshop.
- Shared reading will bridge the skills of a reader and those of a test taker. This is done daily.
- Interactive read aloud will provide student and teacher to collaboratively model reading strategies.
- Teacher labs will be provided for teacher observation. This will allow teachers to collaborate and further develop their Reader's Workshop strategies, small group, strategy, conferences and data collection.
- PD will be provided monthly to develop teachers understanding and skills in providing instruction based on text bands, small group lesson planning and data collection.
- mClass and F&P will be completed for the beginning, middle and end of the year.
- Progress monitoring will completed according the UCPS progress monitoring calendar.
- Instructional Coach Natalie Brucia will be coaching teachers, providing PD, analyzing data, providing resources for reading lessons, teaching lessons and providing us with input and resources on the computer for students to access.
- EC and ESL will be pushing into classrooms to support their students during Reader's Workshop.
- Students will take the BOG and PEOG to monitor their student's current learning as teachers prepare for the EOGs.
- Use of student reading buddies throughout the building.

Professional Development

Goal: By June 2018, teachers will complete at least 60 hours of professional development.

Strategies:

- Teachers will participate in a 2 day reading PD with Gravity Goldberg
- Teachers, administrators, support staff, and county specialists will offer 2-3 hours of PD each month
- PD will cover multiple content areas
- Staff will participate in five 3 hour sessions of MTSS PD
- Staff will participate in PD during grade level sessions
- Amount of PD time will be tracked through the use of timestamped sign in sheets
