#### **Agenda:** School Performance Report Cards Grade:

1. Looked closely at the School Performance grade that was just released in the 2013-2014 North Carolina School Report Card- from the Public Schools of North Carolina- Sardis earned 70 points which is a B school. Because of the 15 point scale we fell right at the B mark. Next year the state will be moving to a 10 point scale- if we were to perform this year exactly as we did last year, we will receive a grade of C.
2. Our Site Base Team discussed the need to push with deeper levels of thinking across the school in reading, writing, math, and science.
3. It was discussed how important everyone's contribution is to the success of our school. Teachers will continue to collaborate with each other and our Curriculum Specialists to find ways we will go deeper in teaching.
4. Sardis' overall proficiency was 67%: Reading 62%, Math 68%, Science 75%. In reviewing our growth, the only AMO subgroup that did not make growth was our Caucasian group.
5. It is our mission to challenge and increase high growth and achievement with this and all subgroups. Sardis will continue to promote good communication with parents and involve them in motivating their students at home.
6. As a team- what goals/proficiency percentage would you like to see us achieve at the end of this year? All team members agreed upon a goal of 80-90%
7. Mrs. Benson. Each teacher should be looking at 80-85% of their children being on grade level by the end of the year to pass EOGs with a 4 or 5. Being proficient (Level 3) is not enough. We must raise the bar with instruction and expectations for learning. We are all in this together.
