We are losing the neighborhoods on the other side of 74, but will gain the remainder of Suburban Estates. We also do not know the number of students that may look to stay through grandfathering/transfers, etc.</li> <li>We used to have that system. With new Supervisor, it seems to have disappeared. If the Transportation Department gets the changes to us in a timely manner, we could implement this, when necessary.</li> </ol>
