Stallings Site-Based Meeting

The Site-based committee met on Wednesday March 24, 2010 at Stallings Elementary.

Those present were: Bill Breckenridge - Principal, P.J. Theiler - Chairman, Beth Welch-Secretary, Stephanie Hymes, Maggie Harris, Bonnie Blair, Lisa Rushing, Todd Humphrey, Lynn LeFlore, Cathy Sumner, Carolyn Nichols, Mary Brigid-Spence – parent, and Beth Diggs – parent. Cliff Harrington – parent, and Laura Gaddy – AP were absent from the meeting.

First item discussed was tutoring. Todd Humphrey stated that tutoring is on target. He says we are where we need to be to help these students. He also said we are tutoring more students than we originally thought. The schools preliminary results for the 5th grade assessments are equal to last year. Mr. Humphrey stated that some teachers are not tutoring for 3-5 grades and therefore may tutor students in their own classes.

Second item on the agenda was the social committee. Mr. Breckenridge drew up new guidelines and these guidelines will be put on moodle for all staff to see. He wants all staff members to review the new guidelines and then vote and the majority vote rules.

Mr. Breckenridge also stated that Stallings student numbers are low and that we need about 100 total kindergarten students to keep all of our teachers here. Mr. Breckenridge also stated the Porter Ridge Cap has been lifted.
