

Dress Down/Jean Day Dress Code Guidelines

Students should dress appropriately for casual days. **Dress down/jean days will be designated days announced and determined by the school.** Uniforms are strictly enforced all other school days. Their clothing should not be a distraction to the learning environment and should be comfortable for all school activities. The education of students is our highest priority and student clothing should not serve as a hindrance to that purpose.

Clothing must cover all undergarments and the midriff. Any clothing that causes a distraction to the learning environment will be referred to administration and action to resolve the dress code violation will be taken. Logos or garments that promote or advertise alcohol, drugs, tobacco, gang affiliation, nudity, profanity, violence, and/or contain inappropriate saying/pictures are not allowed and may be confiscated.

Appropriate dress for casual jean days will be:

Tops:

- ALL shirts must have sleeves
- Shirts must not reveal any areas of the waist or upper body (NO CLEAVAGE)
- Midriff must be covered at ALL times

Bottoms:

- Pants for either gender must cover undergarments at all times.
- Pants for either gender must be worn at the waist. (no “sagging” pants).
- Shorts must be at least fingertip length for boys and girls.
- Skirts must be at least fingertip length.
- Jeans/Pants that require lacing are not permitted.
- No holes of any size above the knee are permitted (Patched or otherwise).

Footwear:

- Shoes/footwear are to be worn at all times on school grounds
- Shoes/footwear requiring laces must be tied.
- Shoes/footwear with straps must be fastened.
- Shoes/footwear may not have heels over 2” in height.

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Other items not allowed:

- Yoga pants
- Tank tops or sleeveless shirts
- Pajamas
- Lounge pants
- Bedroom shoes/slippers
- Bandanas/hats/headscarves/"doo rags"
- Sunglasses and non-prescription eyewear
- Chains, spiked jewelry or spiked accessories (including belts)

The school reserves the right to address new fashions not mentioned in this document as they become available to student consumers. Fashions must be appropriate for a minor-aged, educational setting.
