#UHaveAVoice Anti-Bullying Campaign Video Challenge: 2018

<u>Overview:</u> October is Anti-Bullying month. Between 1 in 3 students say they are bullied at school and this remains a prevalent and serious problem in today's schools. Most bullying occurs in middle school and this can extend outside the classroom via cyberbullying. UCPS does not tolerate bullying and we would like our students to be informed and aware of how to prevent bullying.

<u>Objective</u>: Last year our campaign was a success! This year we'd like to challenge UCPS students to create a 30 second anti-bullying campaign video to be featured on the district website and social media platforms that offers inclusive strategies students of all grade levels can do to make other students feel included.

Weekly video submissions are encouraged and a winning video will be selected each Friday of October beginning on October 5. Schools, clubs, and classes may submit multiple videos. The Communications Office will accept submissions from October 1, 2018 through November 2, 2018. Please share this opportunity with your students and follow the guidelines below.

Submission Guidelines:

- Create a 30 second anti-bullying video featuring inclusive strategies for student use in the program/app of your choice.
- The video must be created under the supervision of a teacher or approved UCPS employee.
- Please be sure that everyone in the video has a current/signed photo release on file at the school.
- The video needs to convey an anti-bullying message applicable to students of all ages.

- Upload completed videos to your school's YouTube channel and share the link to the uploaded video in an email to becky.swiger@ucps.k12.nc.us
- Videos should be submitted by 12 p.m. each Friday beginning on October 1 to be reviewed for selection (Video submissions will not be considered after Wednesday, October 31 at noon).



Most home printer/scanners will allow you to adjust the default scanning resolution. The main photo must be from the current year and feature the student alone. Tribute Sizes:

1/2 = \$195, 6 pictures max

Parking passes are not guaranteed available throughout the school year. Once we sell out we will start a waiting list. Students obtaining their license during the school year are not guaranteed a spot, and may have to wait until the following year to drive. We will have a waitlist for those students bringing in all appropriate documentation. We have 14 spaces left.


Cougar Athletic Pass (For Parents and Students)

- We cannot guarantee a spot after the October 31st deadline as the placement of pages will be set for the book and cannot be changed.
- A final proof will be emailed to you. You will have 48 hours to respond. If you do not then
 we will call you. If we still don't hear from you then it will be submitted as is.
- If this is a secret or surprise for you child, we need to know.

Things to keep in mind when creating the perfect message.

- It cannot be plagiarized. Use your own words.
- Avoid cliches. Make it more personal.
- Keep it short and to the point. Remember you only have limited space. You may have to chose between words and photos if you get too wordy.

Things to know about the photos.

- No Black and White Photos
- No collage pictures you created.
- Understand that photos will be cropped and flipped to compliment the overall design.
- If you have multiple students (twins etc..) the number of photos allowed will change as it takes up more space with a second person. However, we can work with you.
- Submit good, quality photos. Make sure they scan at the highest resolution.
- If you are have difficulty choosing your photos, make an appointment with Mrs. Pentecost and she can help you choose what would look good together.
- Baby pictures are fine but please make them less than half of the overall number of photos.
 This is designed to be a record of their years in high school.
