



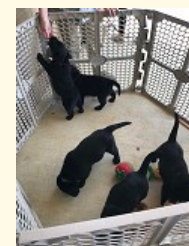
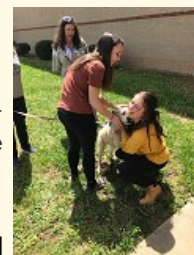

## Robotics Team Places 3rd in UCPS Event

The CATA Robotics Club sent three teams to the Union County CTE Spring Robotics Tournament. The tournament featured thirty-six teams from high schools in Union County. During the first half of the competition teams are randomly paired with another team, to challenge another randomly generated pair. From these challenges the top 32 teams are selected. Two of the CATA teams made the top 32. From these, the top 16 teams form an alliance with a team in the bottom 16. The teams select robots that are built with options to complement their robot. These 16 pairs challenge in a best 2 out of 3 format. The CATA team, Brotherhood of Steel, placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the final challenge. The team is comprised of **Taylor Shaw, Kieran Lorrain and Ben Rodgers**. This is the first time this team has competed.
