
CATA Theatre to Perform A Raisin in the Sun

This year at Central Academy of Technology & Arts, students from the theatre department will come together to perform A *Raisin in the Sun* by Lorraine Hansberry. The production will feature CATA's first ever theatrical partnership with a local Union County elementary as the character of Travis in A *Raisin in the Sun* will be played by Malik Logan, a 5th grader from nearby Benton Heights.

Written in 1957, A Raisin in the Sun follows the life of an African American family, the Youngers, living in Chicago in the 1950s for a few weeks. Just having received a life insurance policy check for \$10,000 from the late Mr. Youngers, the rest of the family ponders on what to do with the money. Mama (played by Iyanna Brooks) wants to buy a house to fulfil the dream she had with Mr. Youngers before he died, Mama's son, Walter Lee (played by Aamar Culbreth), wants to use the money to purchase a liquor store with a friend, Walter's wife, Ruth (played by Caitlyn Brown), agrees with Mama and wants a chance to build a new life with opportunity with Walter and their son, Travis, and, finally, Walter's sister, Beneatha (played by Zelda Gyampoh), wishes to use the money for her medical school tuition.

However, once the Youngers' future neighbors find out they are moving into a predominantly white neighborhood, Clybourne Park Improvement Association tries to bribe the Youngers into moving out. Due to this common occurrence during the 1950s, the Youngers must stick together and believe that they can no longer put off their dreams if they want a happy life.

Since its debut in 1959, A Raisin in the Sun has had many re-openings both on stage and on screen with new actors and directors stepping up to tackle the riveting show. One of the most recent and well known stages that A Raisin in the Sun performed on was in the 2014 Tony Awards where it won Best Revival of a Play.







"The show is like poetry. Every single line is a piece of poetry and it's a show that keeps you captivated," Zelda Gyampoh shares why she thinks A Raisin in the Sun is such a popular show throughout history.

Iyanna Brooks also shares why this show has such a big impact on people of color at CATA and why it is important that we are now doing it, "I think that getting the opportunity to audition and be in a play that is only people of color has really boosted our confidence in ourselves. [Ms. Fairchild] has the confidence that we can do [the show] and we have the confidence that we can prove to the school just because you're a person of color doesn't mean you should be overlooked for cast."

"I think everyone should come see the show because it's the most exciting and moving plays that I've ever been a part of," Aamar Culbreth comments on why everyone should come out and see A Raisin in the Sun.

Central Academy will be performing A Raisin in the Sun on May 31st and June 1st at 7:00 pm.

Exam Study Tips:

Be on time! Students should be in their testing locations before 8:50 a.m. They will not be admitted to exams once testing has begun. Students are encouraged to sleep well each night (8 hours), and have a healthy breakfast each morning. Students should start bringing their Chromebooks to their testing room at 8:15 AM.

Create a study calendar and stick to it

Ask your teacher for a study guide and USE IT!!

Use your notebook to guide you through a review of the course

Attend all review sessions offered

Go to tutoring for extra support

Make a study group, assign each person a topic to re-teach, and discuss each topic

Have your parents ask you questions

Use diagrams, graphs, pictures, and drawings in your textbook to serve as a

talking point for you to review

Make flashcards on your computer or phone to practice important vocabulary words

Look at your scores from the semester and identify topics you struggled in – ask

your teacher or a friend for help

Stay after school to study – let an administrator know which days your study

group needs to stay and study and we will arrange for you to stay to study

Rewrite important points, the act of writing or typing helps some people remember specific information

Create an acronym, or a funny saying, or song to remember specific information

Draw a quick sketch to help with definitions or concepts

Practice math problems

Type of Exams: We have four types of exams at the end of each semester – EOC, NC Finals, CTE State Assessment, and Teacher-Made. Teachers will address which type of exam their students will take.

Spring Semester Exam Dates 2018-19 Continued

Exam Exemptions for Teacher Made Exams ONLY:

High School students will not be required to take a <u>teacher-made final exam</u> in a course in the following situations:

- The student has an average of **90** or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than **2 unexcused absences** in the class; or
- The student has an average of **80** or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than **1 unexcused absence** in the class.

Attendance: Attendance during exam days is required for all students, for both exam sessions and review sessions. Our normal school hours apply, but the schedule and lunch times are adjusted. **June 6** is an important day for any students who have missed an exam earlier in the week due to illness. We regret that family vacation plans are not excused, and students cannot take exams early. We apologize that any requests for exceptions cannot be honored.

Testing Window: All exam testing must be completed between May 31 and June 6. This is true for ALL types of exams: EOC, NC Final Exams, CTE State Assessments, and Teacher-Made. Students may not test early, and if absent on an exam day, they must make arrangements to be at school on the make-up day in order to meet the approved testing window time-frame.

Score Results: All high school exams count 25% of a student's grade for the semester. Please emphasize this point to students so that they study.

Exam review: All teachers are expected to help students with review during class time and to distribute a review guide to students prior to testing. Students should begin organizing and reviewing material

Academic Integrity: Please remind students of the need to prepare well for the exams and to make sure that they make ethical decisions when taking exams. The penalty for cheating of any kind is a "0" on a final exam.

Students will be required to turn in cell phones during testing sessions. If they do not want to do this, they should not bring their cell phone into the school.

ATTENDANCE AND EARLY DISMISSAL FACTS AND PROCEDURES

An attendance letter will be sent home with students after the 3rd, 6th, and 8th unexcused absence. At this time students will be notified if they owe recovery time for absences.

Article VII - Duties of the Officers

Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the PTSO and the Executive Committee, shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed in these Bylaws assigned to him/her by the PTSO or by the executive committee; and shall be an ex-officio and coordinate the work of the officers and committees of the PTSO in order that the objectives may be accomplished. He/she will be on the signature card with the Treasurer and the Vice President. The President shall also review and initial bank statements each month.

Section 2. The Vice President shall act as an aide to the President and shall perform the duties of the President in the absence of or the inability of the president to act. He/she will be on the signature card with the Treasurer and the President. He/she shall perform such other delegated duties as may be assigned to him/her by the organization or by the executive board, and shall be a member ex-officio of all committees, except the nominating committee.

Section 3. The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings of the PTSO and of the Executive Committee; and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated; and shall maintain a current and accurate roster of the membership.

Section 4. The Treasurer a. The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the PTSO; shall keep a full and accurate account of receipts and expenditures; shall make disbursements as authorized by the President, Executive Committee, or the PTSO. b. The Treasurer shall present a financial statement at every meeting of the PTSO and at other times when requested by the Executive Committee and shall make a full report at the meeting at which new officers assume their duties. c. The Treasurer shall keep permanent books of accounts and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the PTSO, including, specifically the number of its members and the dues collected from its members. d. The Treasurer's accounts shall be examined annually by an Auditing Committee who, satisfied that the Treasurer's annual report is correct, shall sign a statement of that fact at the end of the report. The Treasurer shall maintain the PTSO checking account. The checks must be signed by two of the following: President, Vice President, or Treasurer. e. Financial records and books shall be audited annually by July 1 each year. f. Treasurer is responsible to file necessary paperwork required by State and Federal Government to maintain non-profit status.


