If your senior pictures will not be taken until after that date then make sure you communicate that with her. Space will not be available after October 31st. Don't miss out. Please see the senior tribute order form in this newsletter. Below are the prices and sizes along with how many pictures you can submit for each size. Know that if you write a long message that you may have to eliminate one or more photos. The yearbook staff will work with you to design the best tribute to recognize your senior. You can order senior tributes online as well using the URL above. If you don't see the option to order a tribute/ad, turn off any pop up blockers you might have on your browser and reload the page. All photos need to be received at CATA by October 31st. You can either send digital copies of photos or bring in print copies that we will scan for you. The highest resolution of digital file possible is best so we have options for resizing, etc. A dot per inch (dpi) number of 600 is good. Most home printer/scanners will allow you to adjust the default scanning resolution. The main photo must be from the current year and feature the student alone.

Tribute Sizes:

Things you need to know
