11th Graders/Juniors ONLY, The PSAT/NMSQT REGISTRATION is available to you NOW. The test is on **October 13**, and is optional. UCPS will cover the cost for 11th graders who opt to participate in the PSAT/NMSQT. Only UCPS 11th graders are eligible to register. Students will have to be logged into their UCPS Google Drive to complete the form below by **August 10– do not delay.** [CLICK HERE TO REGISTER](#). See more details on page 4.

Parking Passes– Parking Pass sales will begin on **Thursday, 8/12 for seniors only, Friday, 8/13 for Juniors only, Monday, 8/16 for Sophomores only, and Tuesday 8/17 first come, first served.** The process for purchasing parking passes will be on the online platform “**FamilyID**” again this year (the same system as athletic paper work). An account will need to be created if you do not already have one. A link to the application will be on the CATA website beginning on Thursday, 8/12 at 8:00 AM. Parking passes MAY NOT be purchased by any student owes outstanding fees. Any student who does not follow the guidelines above will have their application deleted and will have to resubmit. After completion of the application, CATA will review your submission. The student will then receive a link to pay for the pass once the application has been approved via student UCPS email. Information about **seniors painting parking spots** will be sent to seniors separately. **The PTSO will be sponsoring a Senior Parking Space Paint Party on Friday, August 20th for all Seniors. Pass holders will get an extra COOL treat. More details to follow.**

Student Schedules will be distributed by UCPS email for 10-12 grade students on August 16. Freshmen will receive a copy of their schedule at orientation on August 17. There is detailed information about schedules on **page 3.**

New to UCPS Freshman Student Orientation is on Tuesday, August 17 for ALL new NINTH grade students who are new to UCPS at 10:00 AM in the media center. After this event the freshmen will go to the Freshman Orientation from 11-1. New to UCPS Freshman parents may choose to drop in to the gym from 10 to 10:30 to meet our PTSO parents and some staff for coffee and pastries. PTSO parents and staff will be available to answer questions and discuss both the high school and academy studies with you. **New to UCPS Students will receive Chrome-books and technology information at this time.**

Freshman Orientation is on Tuesday, August 17 for ALL NINTH grade students from 11:00 AM—1:00 PM. Students will meet in our theatre. Parents should drop students off. Freshman Orientation activities are for students only. Parents may choose to drop in to the gym from 11 to 11:30 to meet our PTSO parents and some staff for coffee and pastries. PTSO parents and staff will be available to answer questions and discuss both the high school and academy studies with you. Schedules and Bus Info will be given to students DURING their orientation.

New Sophomore Orientation (10th graders new to CATA) will be on Tuesday, August 17 from 1:30—2:30. Please meet in room 401—or what we call “the fishbowl”. Parents are welcome to drop in to the guidance office between 1:30-2:00 to ask questions about school procedures. Feel free to just drop your student off.

Open House for all current 10th-12 grade students—Wednesday, August 18, 9:00—12:00 PM. Purchase lockers, bus information, spirit wear, senior shirts and signs, and parking passes (see Priority Times on page 2). Lockers can be rented for \$5 for the year. Schedules will be emailed to students through their UCPS email.

Student Schedules/Schedule Corrections

Counselors will be diligently working on schedules during July and August. All schedules are not final until you receive a copy of it. If you are somehow able to view your schedule in PowerSchool it is NOT correct or complete. **Freshmen and new 10th graders will receive a copy of their schedule at orientation on August 17. All students in 9th-12th grade will be emailed a copy of their schedule on August 16.**

Students will either receive the classes they selected during registration last Spring or students will see **"Please See Counselor"** in their schedule. We will not randomly give 10th-12th grade students classes they did not register for; therefore, we enter **"Please See Counselor"** as a placeholder in the event a class did not make or there is a conflict that needs to be discussed with the student. If a student has **"Please See Counselor"** in their schedule, they will have the opportunity to meet with their counselor in-person on **August 19 and August 20 from 12:00pm – 3:30pm.**

If a student does not have **"Please See Counselor"** in their schedule then the student received the courses they selected during registration in the Spring. Students who do not have **"Please See Counselor"** in their schedule but would like to request a correction to their schedule for a valid specified reason will have the opportunity to do so during the **Schedule Correction** process.

The **Schedule Correction** form will be open from **August 23 to August 27.** More information on this process is forthcoming.

We ask that you please respect the process and not email the School Counselors to inquire about schedule changes throughout the summer as School Counselors do not work full time in the summer. They look forward to filling schedule holes in August or responding to requests during the first five days of the semester. Please note that email requests for schedule changes will not be accepted. All schedule correction requests must be entered into the Schedule Correction form that will be open the first five days of school.

Seniors will receive information during senior night that will be important for their individual counselor meetings. Again, attendance is strongly encouraged. 11th Graders/Juniors ONLY, The PSAT/NMSQT REGISTRATION is available to you NOW- do not delay!

Here's what you need to know about the PSAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test:

- **October 13, 2021**, PSAT/NMSQT will be promoted as **OPTIONAL** for any 11th grader who wishes to participate.
- UCPS will cover the cost for 11th graders who opt to participate in the PSAT/NMSQT.
- Only UCPS 11th graders are eligible to register.

Senior Portraits

It is now time to schedule your senior portraits through CADY. You must have your portrait taken by CADY to be in our yearbook.

1. CADY has a studio at Crown Point Plaza in Matthews.
 2. When you go to the website, search for Central Academy, pick an additional scene, and then click continue.
 3. On the next page you will see prices for session (sitting) fees. If you want the basic \$30 option then scroll to the bottom of the page and select simple session.
 4. Your session fee (sitting fee) is the fee you are paying for the photographers to take your picture and there are a lot of different priced options with multiple locations, dedicated photographers, makeup artists, etc. This fee DOES NOT pay for any of the photos that you might want. You will have to purchase your photos after you receive your proofs.
 5. Make sure to remove any pre-checked items you do not want such as double proofs, retouching, etc.
 6. Select your date and time, create an account, and pay the sitting fee.
 7. Show up for your appointment date and time you selected to get your pictures taken.
 8. After your pictures are taken you'll receive a portfolio in the mail. Keep anything you'd like to purchase and return everything else in the enclosed postage-paid envelope.
 9. Remember, we want 100% of our seniors represented in this book but we can't do it without you.
 10. Yearbook and senior tribute orders can be placed once school starts in the fall. The yearbook is always at its lowest price the first week of school so order early to get the best deal!

Information for New CATA Families

- School day hours: 9:05-3:45 (Class starts at 9:05, students should all **arrive by 8:55** when the first bell rings to move to class.) If you are dropping your student off by car, you should arrive between 8:40—8:55 to ensure that your child can get to class on time.
- Lunches are determined by the 3rd block teacher. We will inform students of their lunch time on the first day of school.
- Upon arrival on the first day of school, all students will report to Advisory first. Advisory assignments will be posted at the front of the school.
- Set uniforms are not required for PE classes, but a dress code is strictly enforced. This will be discussed during the first day of class. Sneakers, athletic shorts, and t-shirt are required every day.
- Lockers are not required, but you may rent a locker for \$5.00. **PE Lockers are required.** Your PE teacher will provide information. NO students may leave their belongings out in the PE locker room—ALL belongings must be secured with a school-issued lock. Students will be charged for missing locks.
- Supply lists will be posted on Teacher's Public Canvas pages on Thursday 8/19.
- Attendance is taken during each class, and it is vital that you are present at school every day for every class. If you must make doctor appointments during the school day, be sure to do so at different times of the day so you do not miss too many days in one class.
- Attendance matters for participation in extracurricular activities, credit for courses, and affects eligibility for sports. **Students too sick to come to school may not be on school grounds for extracurricular events that day.** Absence notes MUST be turned in or emailed within three days of an absence to [Mr. William Smith](#).
- Every teacher will have a web page (on Canvas) for students and parents to access with course information.
- All students will receive a student login/password to the Parent Portal so that they can see their grades. This will become active on Monday, September 6.
- Students are expected to check their school email account daily as both teachers and administration use this to communicate with students.
- Please take the time to read or browse the Cougar Chronicle each week. All important school information is in the newsletter.
