



# **PTSO Officer Nominations**

We are approaching spring elections for the PTSO. Please see job descriptions below and consider serving our CATA Community. Please <u>click here</u> for the nomination form.

Article VII - Duties of the Officers Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings of the PTSO and the Executive Committee, shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed in these Bylaws assigned to him/her by the PTSO or by the executive committee; and shall be an ex-officio and coordinate the work of the officers and committees of the PTSO in order that the objectives may be accomplished. He/she will be on the signature card with the Treasurer and the Vice President. The President shall also review and initial bank statements each month.

Section 2. The Vice President shall act as an aide to the President and shall perform the duties of the President in the absence of or the inability of the president to act. He/she will be on the signature card with the Treasurer and the President. He/she shall perform such other delegated duties as may be assigned to him/her by the organization or by the executive board, and shall be a member ex-officio of all committees, except the nominating committee.

Section 3. The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings of the PTSO and of the Executive Committee; and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated; and shall maintain a current and accurate roster of the membership.

Section 4. The Treasurer a. The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the PTSO; shall keep a full and accurate account of receipts and expenditures; shall make disbursements as authorized by the President, Executive Committee, or the PTSO. b. The Treasurer shall present a financial statement at every meeting of the PTSO and at other times when requested by the Executive Committee and shall make a full report at the meeting at which new officers assume their duties. c. The Treasurer shall keep permanent books of accounts and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and disbursements of the PTSO, including, specifically the number of its members and the dues collected from its members. d. The Treasurer's accounts shall be examined annually by an Auditing Committee who, satisfied that the Treasurer's annual report is correct, shall sign a statement of that fact at the end of the report. The Treasurer shall maintain the PTSO checking account. The checks must be signed by two of the following: President, Vice President, or Treasurer. e. Financial records and books shall be audited annually by July 1 each year. f. Treasurer is responsible to file necessary paperwork required by State and Federal Government to maintain non-profit status.

# Mr. Recher's Pre-Engineering Students MINI CIVIL COMPETITION FIELD TRIP TO UNCC

Some students of the Pre-Engineering Academy, 31 juniors and 9 seniors, recently competed in the "Mini Civil Competition" at UNCC College of Engineering. The eight teams from CATA competed against twenty other teams from all around the Charlotte metro area. The competition consisted of four civil engineering categories: structural, transportation, geotechnical, and environmental. Collectively CATA teams did very well earning the following awards:

Geotechnical – Most Efficient: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Geotechnical – Highest Capacity: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place

Environmental – 1st place

Transportation – Most Efficient: 3rd place

The transportation category consisted of two activities, one being a brain exercise to see if teams could collaborate to find the best way to plan out travel plans that incorporate public transportation; the second activity was to measure each person's reaction time. For the environmental portion the activity was to build a water filter to "clean" dirty water and make change the pH from 4 to 7. The third activity was geotechnical which dealt with the physical properties of soil (dirt). Each group was challenged to build an MSE wall from the cheapest materials and let it hold the most weight with the least deflection. The last activity was dealing with the structural aspect of civil engineer-







ing. The teams constructed Popsicle stick bridges within specifications at their schools and then brought them to the competition to test the maximum load the bridges could support before failing.

A common theme in the competition was the efficient use of materials and money to successfully complete the challenges. Just about all problems in engineering can be solved with enough time and money. The real challenges are finding solutions with limited amounts of time and money.

# Science Olympiad Students Compete

Students won medals in Amazing Mechatronics (4th), Anatomy and Physiology (5th), Chemistry Lab (8th), Ecology (1st), Forensics (5th), Helicopters (6th), Materials Science (4th), Microbe Mission (7th), Mission possible (4th), and rocks and Minerals (3rd). Some students will be invited to States for ecology and rocks and minerals. The students are preparing an article describing their day and we will post the article and pictures in the next edition.

# VAPING FACT SHEET

## WHAT IS VAPING?



Electronic Nicotine Delivery Systems (ENDS) include personal refillable vaporizers, e-cigarettes, and vape pens. Cartridges contain, or tanks are filled, with e-liquid or juice composed of nicotine, flavoring, and other chemicals. The liquid is heated by the device into a vapor, or aerosol, and inhaled. Some devices can be adapted to vape marijuana, cannabis oil, and wax.




#### WHO IS VAPING?

ENDS use has increased dramatically among youth. The <u>CDC</u> reports that 16% of high schoolers used e-cigarettes regularly in 2015, up from 1.4% in 2011 (<u>Other research</u> shows high schoolers regular use in 2015 as high as 24%). Regular use in middle school increased from <1% in 2011 to 5.3% in 2015. Nearly 38 percent of high schoolers reported having tried an e-cigarette at least once in 2015.

The considerable increase in e-cigarette use among U.S. youth in recent years corresponds with increases in advertising expenditures, from from \$6.4 million in 2011 to \$115 million in 2014.

## THE TRUTH ABOUT VAPING:

Vape pens and e-cigarettes have been in existence for just about a decade and there is little scientific research available as to the long term effects. It is <u>advertising and marketing</u> that promote the messages about safety to encourage the sale of their products. The products available online and in retail stores offer thousands of candy, fruit, and dessert flavors attractive to young consumers.

Nicotine is the highly addictive chemical in tobacco products and is present in e-liquids, sometimes even in the products labeled to have zero nicotine. Adolescent brains are particularly sensitive to <u>nicotine's effects</u>, and exposure at a young age may cause lasting harm to brain development and prime the brain's reward system for other addictions.

The solvents that are vaporized along with nicotine and flavorings include glycerin and propylene glycol. These are listed (in the 1970s) by the FDA as Generally Recognized As Safe (GRAS), specific to use in food, and does not apply to other uses, like aerosolizing and inhaling.

Studies show lower levels of toxicants released by ENDS than by conventional cigarettes, but similar size and number of nanoparticles. While more research is needed to determine the long term health effects of vaping, there is scientific evidence that vaping is not benign and inhalation is associated with adverse effects on lung health. "Safer" does not equal "safe".

According to the World Health Organization, e-cigarettes are not a legitimate guitting aid. The FDA's Center for Drug Evaluation and Research has not approved any e-cigarette as a safe or effective method to help smokers quit. Instead of quitting, many e-cigarette users are continuing to use e-cigarettes while still using conventional cigarettes.

#### What Parents Can Do:

- Talk to your children about not smoking and not vaping. Make your expectations clear. Take advantage of teachable moments.
- Research online and read about vaping. Make sure the articles you read are science-based and include facts, not opinions.
- Ash your child what things are if you see a device that you are unsure of. Open it, see what it is.


