

Attendance Information for Parents and Students

Ninth grade parents, please note that High School Attendance is different than middle school. It is taken by class, not by day. Stu-dents with more than 7 absences in a course can fail the class due to Absences alone, regardless of their grade average in the class.

Attendance at school is Priority. It is so important to be present in order to learn and to gain opportunities for mastering coursework. This is also a very important life lesson for our children to learn—in life we have expectations of going to work and working to the best of our ability, and this good life habit starts with attendance at school.

- To ensure maximum student attendance we will be contacting students and parents when students reach 3, 6, and 8 absences. The numbers 3,6, and 8 are for Total absences, both excused and unexcused.
- According to UCPS attendance policy students should not miss more than 7 classes in each class. The goal
 is to not miss ANY school, but if a student has a valid reason, such as an illness or other excused absence,
 they can have up to 7 absences and still pass the class.
- It is important that excuse notes be written and turned into the office within 3 days after an absence. After the three days, then the absences are recorded as unexcused permanently.
- At each absence threshold (3,6,8) CATA staff will make the determination if the student needs to begin the recovery process to make up absences and notify parents and students on how to make up time missed from school. Recovery should be done dur-ing the semester and in the two week time span given or the student will not be allowed to recover the absences at a later date. There are UCPS limits on how many classes can be recovered. Recovery will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school with Ms. Riley, or with the student's individual teacher. Students are expected to work on content during recovery time. This plan is in place so that your student makes up content close to the date it was delivered in class. CATA feels this is most effective.

Dance Academy Seniors

The CATA dance academy participated in the First Charlotte Ballet Middle and High School dance festival. Students could pick from various classes ranging from Ballet to African. After a full day of classes, students were then invited to watch a concert that had surrounding High school and middle school students performing. Our senior class dancers were picked to perform Serum and The Wind Knocked Out in the performance, after the dances were adjudicated earlier this year. In addition our students where able to audition for colleges and summer programs. All of our dancers who auditioned



got offers from schools. Sawyer Newsome was offered a full ride to University of South Carolina, \$10,000 to UNC School of the Arts, and \$2,500 to attend Charlotte Ballet summer program. Mackenzie Simons was offered \$5,000 for Winthrop University, and Nicole Palmer was



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\$40,000 to La Roche with a potential of even more.

Network I students got busy wiring the lab this semester. Completing this project means that classes will not have to have network equipment sitting on tables. All will be rack mounted and the



students will access it from PCs. This design is much more flexible, the equipment is always available and safe.





Information System Academies News

Mrs. Bounds' Foundation of Information classes visited UCPS Technology Services to culminate their learning of networks. Students have learned the physical devices that make up a network, the different types of networks, and how media is transmitted across a network.

Their visit began with a welcome and introduction from Mr. Preston McConnell, IT Services Manager, followed by a description of a job responsibility and how it relates to the students from Steve Dugan, Lead Network Engineer; Josh Walker, Lead Enterprise Systems Engineer; Emil Iglesias, Lead Desktop Support; Deago Meadows, LMS Coordinator;



and Casey Rimmer, Lead Instructional Technology Facilitator. Spencer Jarvis commented, "I enjoyed hearing the speakers talk about their jobs. Seeing people who actually do these things really gave a better perspective on careers."

Mr. Iglesias then guided the students through the server room pointing out different devices and explaining how it all worked together for UCPS. Students got a close up look at the racks, cabling and servers. Student, Justin Leiner commented, "What I enjoyed most was I got to see things we talked about in class in real life." "It was interesting to see how much goes into keeping our network running," said Abrey Austin. Jack Wild stated, "I enjoyed seeing what we learned about in class actually being used. I liked to see the servers that all of the schools are connected to."

Mr. Walker conducted a tour of the UCPS Depot, where all Chromebooks are repaired or retired. Students saw the spare parts area, the repair area, shipping and receiving and the graveyard (for parts no longer useable). Isabella Walle commented, "I really enjoyed touring the Depot, and seeing where the engineers worked. It gave me a whole new appreciation for everyone who helps our computers operate as well as they do."

Information Systems—Computer Engineering Students Build a PC

Computer Engineering I students built their 1st PC earlier this month. The class started the year diagnosing problems with previously used PCs. Over the last few weeks, 20 students starting building 10 new PCs from parts. Twelve of the students had nev-



er built a PC or worked on one until this class. All PCs are running a burn in test.



Viewing Student's Grades

- Parents can view student grades through the Parent Portal. Contact the school office if you
 have never obtained information on how to set up an account. If you had an account last year,
 the same account still works.
- Students can view their grades by using the my.ncedcloud.org on their chromebook (3rd iconreads "HB-SIS Student-LEA-900"). The old Parent Portal is ONLY for parents, the student logins will no longer work on that link.
- A note about Canvas grades. Canvas is an instructional platform that is new this year. Teachers are using this to store resources, assignments, and at times—assessments. Teachers can score items on the Canvas platform and students can see grades for INDIVIDUAL assignments there. Students MUST remember that grades in Canvas only include Canvas-based assignments. Most teachers are grading more than what is in Canvas. The official grades are in accessed through the my.ncedcloud.org in that "HB-SIS Student-LEA-900" link. Averages of Canvas grades are NOT official grades. If students have questions they should ask their teacher or an administrator.

What is WorkKeys?

The WorkKeys assessment is a multiple choice test that will be given online to seniors that have or are in the process of completing four Career & Technical Education (CTE) courses in a specific career cluster and consists of three sections (Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information). The assessments measure skills such as reading, math, listening, locating information, and teamwork.

Why is WorkKeys Important?

These are skills that employers feel are critical to job success and can help students understand how they can improve their skills for better paying jobs. Students who take the WorkKeys tests have a clear way to demonstrate their abilities to future employers. A large number of students are entering the workforce without adequate skills to qualify them for the jobs they want. By increasing their skill levels while they are still in school, students increase their opportunities for higher salaries in the future.

What do your WorkKeys Scores mean?

Students have the opportunity to earn an ACT National Career Readiness Certificate. A certificate is provided at the platinum, gold, silver, and bronze levels. Students can use their results to identify jobs for which they are qualified for and improve on areas where their skills are weak.

How can you Prepare for it?

To prepare for the WorkKeys assessments students can login to Keytrain at: http://login.keytrain.com and enter their username: u+ your student ID # (ex. U1234567) and password: 8 digit date of birth (MMDDYYYY – March 3, 1997) (ex. 03031997).

Clean up pet waste to prevent harmful bacteria from washing into our local waterways.
