## Community and the Arts CATA Theater Students are a Hit at NCTC Regionals

The Theatre Academy had a successful weekend at the North Carolina Theatre Conference regional festival. The group received a playwriting award for its production of *Boal* (pronounced Bo-All). Danny Morrison received an excellence in acting award and Emma Finnerty received the Outstanding Acting award for an actress. Mr. Robinson received a directing award, and the show, *Boal*, was named Distinguished Play--Audience Choice. It now goes on to compete at state finals.



*Boal* is the piece written by the senior class. It is inspired by work of Augusto Boal, a Brazilian theatre professional who developed the concept of Theatre of the Oppressed in response to many of the oppressive situations he found in his country and other Latin American countries. His work has become famous worldwide among theatre professionals and various university programs.

Andrew Branca, member of the senior theatre class encountered the ideas of *Boal* through his summer spent at Carnegie Mellon University in the summer high school intensive program. He brought his knowledge and ideas back to share with his classmates and they decided to follow through and create their own piece inspired by the work of Boal.

*Agnes of God* is a three woman play, based upon a real life situation in which a young nun gave birth in a convent with no apparent knowledge that she had even been expecting. In addition, the baby was found strangled after the nun gave birth, and she had no recollection of the event. The basic conflict in the play dealt with the fight for control over the young nun between the court appointed psychiatrist trying to figure out what actually happened and the Mother Superior who believed that the conception had been "of God". The attempts to unravel the mystery lead to a horrifying conclusion that neither woman could have predicted.

The plays performed in the NCTC Regional Play Festival held at Pinecrest HS this past weekend, Oct. 28-29. The shows were only two of sixteen shows presented at the festival. *Boal* was selected as the audience choice to advance to state finals. This is impressive as it was both student written and student directed. The senior theatre class took complete control over the development and presentation of the piece at festival and received a superior rating from both judges--a feat not often matched among most of the participants at the festival. This speaks highly of their work and the work of their senior director.

*Boal* heads off to the NCTC State Play finals held at Greensboro College on Nov. 17 and 18. Sixteen shows from eight regional sites around the state will have advanced to this state festival. Two winners from the state will go on to represent NC at the Southeastern Theatre Conference in March in Kentucky. CATA's production is set to perform at the state festival on Thursday, Nov. 17 at 2:30 pm at Greensboro College.

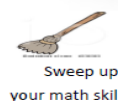

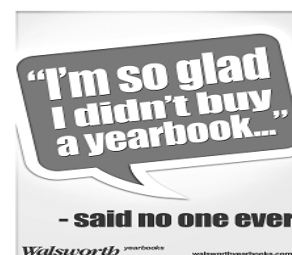

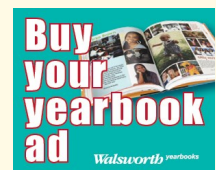

## Work Keys Testing for CTE

### What is WorkKeys?

The WorkKeys assessment is a multiple choice test that will be given online to seniors that have or are in the process of completing four Career & Technical Education (CTE) courses in a specific career cluster and consists of three sections (Applied Mathematics, Locating Information, and Reading for Information). The assessments measure skills such as reading, math, listening, locating information, and teamwork.

### Why is WorkKeys Important?

These are skills that employers feel are critical to job success and can help students understand how they can improve their skills for better paying jobs. Students who take the WorkKeys tests have a clear way to demonstrate their abilities to future employers. A large number of students are entering the workforce without adequate skills to qualify them for the jobs they want. By increasing their skill levels while they are still in school, students increase their opportunities for higher salaries in the future.

### What do your WorkKeys Scores mean?

Students have the opportunity to earn an ACT National Career Readiness Certificate. A certificate is provided at the platinum, gold, silver, and bronze levels. Students can use their results to identify jobs for which they are qualified for and improve on areas where their skills are weak.

### How can you Prepare for it?

To prepare for the WorkKeys assessments students can login to Keytrain at: <http://login.keytrain.com> and enter their username: u+ your student ID # (ex. U1234567) and password: 8 digit date of birth (MMDDYYYY – March 3, 1997) (ex. 03031997).

## Attendance Letters and Recovery

-Attendance at school is a priority. It is so important to be present in order to learn and to gain opportunities for mastering coursework. -According to UCPS attendance policy students should not miss more than 7 classes in each class. The goal is to not miss ANY school, but if a student has a valid reason, such as an illness or other excused absence, they can have up to 7 absences and still pass the class.

-It is important that excuse notes be written and turned into the office within 3 days after an absence. After the three days, then the absences are recorded as unexcused permanently.

- At each absence threshold (3,6,8) CATA staff will make the determination if the student needs to begin the recovery process to make up absences and notify parents and students on how to make up time missed from school. Recovery should be done during the semester and in the two week time span given or the student will not be allowed to recover the absences at a later date.

-There are UCPS limits on how many classes can be recovered. Recovery will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school with Ms. Riley, or with the student's individual teacher. Students are expected to work on content during recovery time. This plan is in place so that your student makes up content close to the date it was delivered in class.

# NC COLLEGE APPLICATION WEEK



## Participating Colleges and Universities

### Overview

NC College Application Week is a state-wide promotional week for NC high school seniors to apply and apply early to colleges and universities in North Carolina. CAW's popularity has led some colleges and universities to decide to entirely waive the application fee during this week. Not every participating college or university waives their application fee; however for those who qualify they will accept the College Board College Application Fee Waiver during CAW.

### Application Fee Waivers Based on Financial Need

Waivers of admission application fees for students with a demonstrated financial need and for whom an application fee would create an undue burden are provided at all of the 36 private colleges and universities as well as all of the 16 University of North Carolina system campuses.

Application fee waivers due to financial hardship are provided to ensure no student is deprived of the opportunity to pursue admission to the institution(s) of their choice.

It is the college's decision as to whether or not the application fee will be waived or deferred.</p>

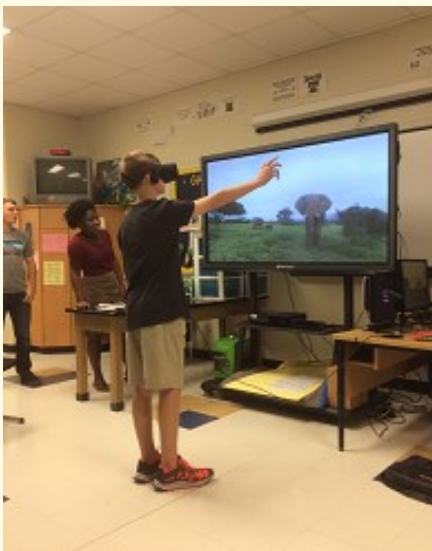
