



Attendance Letters and Recovery

- -Attendance at school is a priority. It is so important to be present in order to learn and to gain opportunities for mastering coursework. This is also a very important life lesson for our children to learn—in life we have expectations of going to work and working to the best of our ability, and this good life habit starts with attendance at school.
- To ensure maximum student attendance we will be contacting students and parents when students reach 3, 6, and 8 absences.
- -According to UCPS attendance policy students should not miss more than 7 classes in each class. The goal is to not miss ANY school, but if a student has a valid reason, such as an illness or other excused absence, they can have up to 7 absences and still pass the class.
- -It is important that excuse notes be written and turned into the office within 3 days after an absence. After the three days, then the absences are recorded as unexcused permanently.
- At each absence threshold (3,6,8) CATA staff will make the determination if the student needs to begin the recovery process to make up absences and notify parents and students on how to make up time missed from school. Recovery should be done during the semester and in the two week time span given or the student will not be allowed to recover the absences at a later date.
- -There are UCPS limits on how many classes can be recovered. Recovery will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school with Ms. Riley, or with the student's individual teacher. Students are expected to work on content during recovery time. This plan is in place so that your student makes up content close to the date it was delivered in class.



Scholarship and College Information

Michael A. DeMayo Scholarship: The Law Offices of Michael A. DeMayo is offering 15 scholarships valued at \$2,500 to high school seniors. To be eligible, you must be a current high school (or homeschooled) senior who attends school in Union County, who has been accepted to or has plans to attend a four-year university, and has a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. All applicants must submit a single package with following items included: (1) Scholarship application that is typed or neatly printed (forms can be found in guidance), a recent photo must be attached with the form, (2) a presentation (video/PowerPoint/brochure/website/essay) that encourages fellow teens to abstain from underage drinking and driving and/or highlights the dangers of drinking and driving, (3) official or unofficial high school transcript (must include class rank, size, and test scores), (4) SAT/ACT scores (if not included in transcript, a printout from CollegeBoard.com is acceptable), (5) and two letters of recommendation (from school, club, or community leaders) that assess the applicant's academic potential, his/her progress and academic achievements, community/school involvement, or volunteer activities. All of these items must be turned in at the same time. Items submitted separately will not be accepted. For information on how to submit an application packet, please see Ms. Cole in guidance. Deadline: March 10, 2017.

Donald and Barbara Mozley Scholarship:: This \$5,000 will be awarded to seven students interested in pursuing an engineering degree. To be eligible, students must: 1). Be a U.S. resident: 2). Have a minimum 3.5 GPA; 3). Have an SAT I math score of 600 or above and critical reading score of 550 or above, and/or an ACT composite score of 27 or above; and 4). Demonstrate financial need. Student will need to submit one letter of recommendation and their completed FAFSA form. "2017-2018 Pre-Apprenticeship Program"

Attention Rising 12th graders, are you interested in getting paid to go to college while in high school; if so, then you should apply to the Pre-Apprenticeship Program. The Pre-Apprenticeship Program is partnered with Greiner Bio-One, South Piedmont Community College, and Union County Public Schools. If selected for the Pre-Apprenticeship Program; the student will take morning classes at CATA while their afternoon is split between classes at SPCC and working at Greiner Bio-One, as well as, be paid for approximately 20 hours per week which is a combination of training, attending classes and work. While in the Pre-Apprenticeship Program, students will receive High School Credit for their Community College courses and it provides a potential opportunity to be selected for the Registered Apprenticeship Program, as well as, providing hands on training to develop technical skills. In order to qualify for the Pre-Apprenticeship Program students must be a rising high school senior, have a current GPA of at least a 2.5, with a minimum GPA of 2.8 at Graduation to be considered for the Registered Apprenticeship Program, have enough high school credits to allow community college courses in their senior schedule and be able to attend a 3-4 week summer program beginning on July 10 2017. 



Class of 2017 Spring Letter

Dear Class of 2017,

We are very proud of every one of you. This spring semester we hope you will enjoy your time with your friends, family, and teachers while maintaining high academic performance. We hope you will have fond memories of CATA and of all the people here. Congratulations on making it to this point in your academic career. We would like to provide you some updated information for of your senior year. We ask that you review the entire letter with your family. We are excited about the remainder of your senior year and want to be sure you know all necessary information and expectations.

Graduation: The ceremony is on Saturday, June 10, 2017 at 7:30 PM at the Winthrop Coliseum (1162 Eden Terrace Rock Hill, SC 29733). Please arrive no later than 6:30 to line up. Please be aware of traffic and plan accordingly to arrive on time. A map and directions will be provided for you on a later date. If you have any questions or need directions, then please visit the website (www.winthrop.edu).

Graduation Practice: Practice is on Friday, June 9, 2017 from 2:00-4:00 PM in the gym. Please arrive no later than 1:45 PM. Be mindful that we must begin at 2:00. Please make sure to make plans to attend the entire practice. Failure to do so will result in not walking at graduation. It is your responsibility to schedule any college functions and work schedules around final exams, graduation practice, and graduation itself. You do not have to wear your cap and gown to practice. If you are speaking at graduation, then you should bring a copy of your speech so you can practice it a couple of times. You will not receive your tickets until the end of practice so make arrangements beforehand.

Attire: Students are expected to dress appropriately and professionally since this is a dignified ceremony. Students at CATA are only permitted to wear CATA issued cords, medallions, and cap and gown. No graduation regalia may be altered in any way.

Ladies: Ladies will need to wear an appropriate dress that is no longer than their gown or dark slacks. There should be no collar showing with the gown. Flip-flops and tennis shoes are not appropriate; however, dressy sandals are appropriate.

Gentlemen: dark pants, a white shirt, black or dark tie or bowtie. No tennis shoes or flip-flops will be allowed.

If you have any questions about your attire, then please ask administration.

Senior Cap and Gown Picture: The above described dress code is what you are expected to wear at the senior cap and gown picture on Tuesday, April 25 in the gym. This occurs during second block and you must be present and in appropriate attire to be included in the picture (be here by 10:30

am if you flex first period).

Senior Week is May 22-26: Please see the schedule below. We will make a separate announcement about the Senior Week Field Trip.

Monday: Seniors wear black, Tie-dye shirts during second block

<u>Tuesday</u>: Senior Toga Tuesday, senior breakfast/ Crown decorating during first block

Wednesday: Senior Trip to the North Carolina Zoo in Asheboro. Wear Tie-dye shirts

<u>Thursday:</u> College or career t-shirt, Field Day (third or fourth block)

<u>Friday</u>: Senior Awards Day 1st and 2nd block, ice cream party and receive yearbooks directly afterward

Senior Awards Ceremony: The ceremony is on Friday, May 26 at 9:00 AM in the auditorium. All seniors are expected to attend.

Graduation Speeches: Each academy has one senior give a speech at graduation. A committee of the faculty and staff of Central Academy choose the individuals for graduation speeches. Students may audition for consideration to this committee in May in the media center conference room. The dates for graduation speech auditions are Monday, May 8 and Tuesday, May 9 at 3:30 PM. Please come to one of the auditions for consideration.

Past due fees: Past due fees must be paid before students may participate in the graduation ceremony. Please make online technology payments through the Central Academy Website, and make all other payments at the school with the bookkeeper. Dr. Wall and other staff will be calling about past due fees in an attempt to settle all fees by the end of March. Students will not receive graduation packets, which include tickets if past due fees are not paid. Any unpaid fee owed to the school or school system must be paid by Wednesday, June 7 to be allowed to participate in a graduation ceremony. We are contacting parents and want to try to resolve fee issues as quickly as possible.

Tickets: Tickets will be on sale beginning May 8– May 26 before/after school in the main office, and will be available to be purchased online: Each senior will receive four (4) free tickets with the opportunity to buy extra tickets at \$7.00 a ticket. Students can pre-purchase as many tickets as they need (go to the CATA website, click on "Event Tickets" on the right tab starting May 8).

Tickets will also be sold at the door before the graduation ceremony.

Everyone (including children) must have a ticket to enter the arena.

Students will not receive their tickets until the end of Graduation practice.

Students owing fees will not receive tickets until fees are paid (see below).

Please keep your receipt for the tickets in case there are any questions.

Students can pay cash/check to pay for the tickets, or order online as shown above.

Graduating from high school is dependent upon earning the number and type of credits needed to earn a diploma. Participating in the graduation ceremony is a privilege, one that your family will truly value as they have spent a lot of time supporting you in your academic studies.

Extra Information about graduation day:

- Graduates must park at the back of the coliseum this will be designated on the directions you
 receive and signs will be up at the coliseum. Guests must park at the front of the coliseum. If any
 of your guests a handicap accessible entrance at the front of the coliseum cars can drive up
 to this entrance to drop their guest off and CATA staff will assist them in getting into the coliseum
 while the driver parks the car.
- Winthrop Coliseum will have police officers and security at the graduation event. Please remind
 your guests that no noisemakers are permitted in the coliseum. The officers represent Winthrop
 and will enforce the Winthrop rules. Guests to the ceremony should plan on arriving 30 minutes
 to an hour in advance to allow for traffic. Winthrop will close the doors to the coliseum once the
 graduation ceremony begins, so all guests need to be in place prior to the 6:00 start time.
- Students should not bring any valuables with them, including phones, into the coliseum, as there will be no place for them to store valuables. Please leave them with your parents.
- A professional photographer will take pictures of the graduates receiving their diploma. Students will receive information on how to order the pictures in their Senior Envelope that they get after the ceremony. Only graduates and staff are permitted on the arena floor.
- At the end of the graduation ceremony all seniors will proceed out of the coliseum and will use the coliseum tunnel to exit at the back of the coliseum, where they will receive their actual diploma, final transcript, picture information, and other important items. An official transcript in a sealed envelope will be in the packet. It is YOUR responsibility to mail it to your college. It is RE-QUIRED by your college for admission. Please make plans to meet your families by walking around the outside of the coliseum toward the front. There are plenty of places to take pictures outside of the arena. Guests and graduates will not be able to stay inside the coliseum for pictures.
