

John M. Belk Scholarship at Davidson College: This scholarship is open to students who demonstrate academic excellence, purposeful engagement in the classroom, in student and civic organizations, on the athletic field, or in the arts. Belk Scholars also exhibit a commitment to the local and global communities. Students who are interested in this scholarship have to be nominated by a school official. To be considered for nomination please submit an interest form to Ms. Cole by the deadline listed below. Thirty students will be invited to Belk Celebration and Selection Weekend, March 22-24, 2018. Class of 2022 Belk Scholars will be announced by April 1, 2018. Amount: An annual renewable scholarship valued at \$69,903 and two special study stipends (up to \$3000 per stipend) to pursue international study and other enrichment opportunities. Deadline: Interest forms are due to Ms. Cole by Oct. 25. Students interested in this scholarship must also apply to Davidson by December 1 (This does not imply Early Decision commitment). More information can be found here.

Centennial Scholarship at NC State: This scholarship is designed for students who are interested in engineering, business management, design, chemistry, polymers, forensics, medical fields, fashion merchandising, and retail management. Students interested in this scholarship need to apply to NC State by the early deadline of Oct. 15. Competitive applicants demonstrate high academic achievement, strong leadership qualities, involvement in extracurricular activities and civic engagement, and an interest in textile-related careers. CATA will be nominating two seniors for this scholarship. If you would like to be considered for nomination, please fill out an interest form and return it to Ms. Cole in guidance by the deadline. If you are not nominated, you can self-

nominate. **Amount:** \$15,000/year for 4 years and \$7,500 in enrichment funds. **Deadline:** Interest forms are due to Ms. Cole by Nov. 1.

**Robertson Scholars Program at UNC Chapel Hill and Duke:** Student must apply for undergraduate admission to Duke and/or UNC Chapel Hill the same year they apply to this program. The program is looking for students who demonstrate purposeful leadership, intellectual curiosity, strength of character, and a collaborative spirit. **Amount:** Tuition and fees, room and board. **Deadline:** November 15, 2017. Application and more information can be found **here.** 

# **Counselors Help Students Prepare for Their Futures**

On Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> the School Counseling Department hosted a **Senior Night**. An extensive packet was given out and reviewed (also located on the CATA School Counseling Page, <u>Click Here</u>). During the presentation the counselors reviewed a Senior Timeline, Options after high school - Four Year School, Two Year School, Military, Work - College Applications, ACT & SAT, Recommendation Letters, Resumes, Financial Aid, and Scholarships.

Starting the week of September 11th the School Counselors began **individual senior meetings**. These purpose of these meetings was to discuss each senior's after high school plan. The meeting was steered by the senior based on their interests and questions. All of these meetings will be concluded by the end of September.

**Financial Aid/FAFSA Night** is scheduled for **Monday**, **October 16th at 6:30 pm**. The School Counselors encourage ALL seniors and parents to attend to learn the financial aid process and how to fill out the FAFSA Form!!!

During the month of October the School Counselors will visit their 9th, 10th, and 11th grade

**Academy Classes** and review Careers, Goals, and College Searches.

**Sophomores:** All Sophomores will take the PreACT on November 3rd.

**JUNIORS**—All juniors will be taking the ACT, a college entrance exam, on February 27, 2018. In order to best prepare all juniors will work on ACT preparation during Cougar Time two times per week. All Juniors will also take the SAT this spring during the school day.

# **Meet the Teachers**

Ms. Gastreich has been teaching for ten years and is in her third year at Central Academy. She has a degree in Health Science, is a registered radiographer, and is certified to teach Health Science, PLTW Human Body Systems, and PLTW Bio-Innovation. She attended Tidewater Community College (Radiographer) and earned a Bachelors in Health Science from Old Dominion University. Major Projects in medical science this year include creating an effective emergency room, study of forensic autopsy, design of a medical innovation, student investigation human anatomy and physiology through a research and statistics based study, student investigation environmental health through water testing, and study of a disease through analysis of lab, imaging and DNA results. Field trips include freshman-Health Career Fair and seniors-Simulation Lab at Carolina's Medical Systems.





Mr. Peters has been teaching for two years and this is his second year at CATA. He is a licensed Physical Therapist, and a graduate of Howard University. Major Projects in medical science this year include students exploring science in action, students building organs and tissues on a skeletal Manikin, using data acquisition software to monitor body functions such as muscle movement, reflex and voluntary action, and respiration, and taking on the roles of biomedical professionals to solve real-world medical cases. The HSII class went to Masterpiece Escape during are lesson on teamwork. The class had to work together to achieve the common goal to escape the room just as medical professionals have to work together to achieve success for patients.

Ms. Turner is in her third year of teaching at CATA. She is a registered nurse and attended the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill for her BA in Psychology and the College of Health Science for my Nursing (Associates) degree. For the junior class, Medical Interventions, we will be making prosthetic arms in a few weeks. Also, her students transform bacteria so that it glows towards the end of the semester. For the freshman class, the next big event will be dissecting sheep hearts. Ms. Turner is the adviser of HOSA.


# October is National Bullying Prevention Month




