

John M. Belk Scholarship at Davidson College: This scholarship is open to students who demonstrate academic excellence, purposeful engagement in the classroom, in student and civic organizations, on the athletic field, or in the arts. Students who are interested in this scholarship have to be nominated by a school official. To be considered for nomination please submit an interest form to Ms. Cole by the deadline listed below. Thirty students will be invited to Belk Celebration and Selection Weekend, March 22-24, 2018. Class of 2022 Belk Scholars will be announced by April 1, 2018. Amount: An annual renewable scholarship valued at \$69,903 and two special study stipends (up to \$3000 per stipend) to pursue international study and other enrichment opportunities. Deadline: Interest forms are due to Ms. Cole by Oct. 25. Students interested in this scholarship must also apply to Davidson by December 1 (This does not imply Early Decision commitment). More information can be found here.

Centennial Scholarship at NC State: This scholarship is designed for students who are interested in engineering, business management, design, chemistry, polymers, forensics, medical fields, fashion merchandising, and retail management. Students interested in this scholarship need to apply to NC State by the early deadline of Oct. 15. Competitive applicants demonstrate high academic achievement, strong leadership qualities, involvement in extracurricular activities and civic engagement, and an interest in textile-related careers. CATA will be nominating two seniors for this scholarship. If you would like to be considered for nomination, please fill out an interest form and return it to Ms. Cole in guidance by the deadline. If you are not nominated, you can self-nominate. Amount: \$15,000/year for 4 years and \$7,500 in enrichment funds. Deadline: Interest forms are due to Ms. Cole by Nov. 1.

Robertson Scholars Program at UNC Chapel Hill and Duke: Student must apply for undergraduate admission to Duke and/or UNC Chapel Hill the same year they apply to this program. Counselors Help Students Prepare for Their Futures

On Tuesday, September 5th the School Counseling Department hosted a **Senior Night**. An extensive packet was given out and reviewed (also located on the CATA School Counseling Page, Click Here). During the presentation the counselors reviewed a Senior Timeline, Options after high school - Four Year School, Two Year School, Military, Work - College Applications, ACT & SAT, Recommendation Letters, Resumes, Financial Aid, and Scholarships.

Starting the week of September 11th the School Counselors began individual senior meetings. The purpose of these meetings was to discuss each senior's after high school plan. The meeting was steered by the senior based on their interests and questions.

Did you know that all freshman will meet with counselors in small groups for 5-6 sessions during the first two grading periods at CATA? It is true. We believe that this transition procedure enables our students to be most successful. Students will get another opportunity during the third and fourth aradina periods at CATA.

Financial Aid/FAFSA Night was held Monday, October 16th. The School Counselors will post

the link to the presentation from CFNC once they release it—parents who attended learned the financial aid process and how to fill out the FAFSA Form!!!

During the month of October the School Counselors are visiting their 9th, 10th, and 11th grade Academy Classes and reviewing Careers, Goals, and College Searches.

Sophomores: All Sophomores will take the PreACT on November 3rd.

JUNIORS—All juniors will be taking the ACT, a college entrance exam, on February 27, 2018. In order to best prepare all juniors will work on ACT preparation during Cougar Time two times per week. All Juniors will also take the SAT this spring during the

school day.

Dear Class of 2018,

Congratulations on making it to this point in your academic career. We are proud of you and encourage you to finish your journey strong. We would like to provide you some preliminary information this fall for your senior year.

Graduation: The ceremony is on Saturday, June 9, 2018 at 6:00 PM at the Winthrop Colise-um **(1162 Eden Terrace** Rock Hill, SC 29733). Please arrive no later than 5:00 to line up. Please be aware of traffic and plan accordingly to arrive on time. A map and directions will be provided for you on a later date (www.winthrop.edu). We will send more specific information about graduation day in the Spring Senior Class of 2018 Letter.

Graduation Practice: Practice is on Friday, June 8, 2018 from 2:00-4:00 PM in the gym. Please arrive no later than 1:45 PM. Be mindful that we must begin at 2:00. Please make sure to make plans to attend the entire practice. Failure to do so will result in not walking at graduation. It is your responsibility to schedule any college functions and work schedules around final exams, graduation practice, and graduation itself. You do not have to wear your cap and gown to practice. If you are speaking at graduation, then you should bring a copy of your speech so you can practice it a couple of times. You will not receive your tickets until the end of practice so make arrangements beforehand.

Attire: Students are expected to dress appropriately and professionally since this is a dignified ceremony. Students at CATA are only permitted to wear CATA issued cords, medallions, and cap and gown. No graduation regalia may be altered in any way.

Ladies: Ladies will need to wear an appropriate dress that is no longer than their gown or dark slacks. There should be no collar showing with the gown. Flip-flops and tennis shoes are not appropriate; however, dressy sandals are appropriate.

Gentlemen: dark pants, a white shirt, black or dark tie or bowtie. No tennis shoes or flip-flops will be allowed.

Students will not receive their tickets until the end of Graduation practice. Students owing fees will not receive tickets until fees are paid (see below).
