You will be receiving a letter from Mrs. Webb with more information and your testing date.

What is ACT WorkKeys? ACT WorkKeys Assessments are the cornerstone of ACT workforce solutions. The assessments measure foundational skills required for success in the workplace, and help measure the workplace skills that can affect job performance. The WorkKeys assessment is a multiple choice test that will be given online to seniors that have or are in the process of completing four Career & Technical Education (CTE) courses in a specific career cluster and consists of three sections (Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, and Workplace Documents).

Why is ACT WorkKeys Important? These are skills that employers feel are critical to job success and can help students understand how they can improve their skills for better paying jobs. Students who take the ACT WorkKeys tests have a clear way to demonstrate their abilities to future employers. A large number of students are entering the workforce without adequate skills to qualify them for the jobs they want. By increasing their skill levels while they are still in school, students increase their opportunities for higher salaries in the future.

What do your ACT WorkKeys Scores mean? Students who successfully complete the three Work-Keys assessments (Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, & Workplace Documents) can earn the Work-Keys National Career Readiness Certificate, a valuable credential for students and job seekers seeking to verify foundational workplace skills. A certificate is provided at the platinum, gold, and silver levels. Students can use their results to identify jobs for which they are qualified for and improve on areas where their skills are weak.

**How can you Prepare for it?** To prepare for the WorkKeys assessments students can login to the WorkKeys Curriculum website.

## **Student Opportunities**

**Cyber Security-** Over this past summer, Nicholas Rangolan, Ryan Spadafore, and Matt Spadafore spent a week in the **Instructional Technology Center at Winthrop University participating in a Gen-Cyber camp**. GenCyber is an initiative sponsored by the National Security Agency (NSA) and National Science Foundation (NSF) to help all students understand correct and safe on-line behavior,

increase diversity and interest in cybersecurity, and explore careers in the cybersecurity workforce. During the camp, students met with cybersecurity experts, solved a variety of challenges and simulations, and engaged in meaningful discussion about how to stay safe online. **Please look for information about the 2018 Summer Camps in future editions of the chronicle.** 

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"Career of the Week – Diagnostic Medical Sonographer"

A Diagnostic Medical Sonographer specializes in creating images of the body's organs and tissues. They tend to work closely with physicians or surgeons before, during, and after medical procedures. Some of their job duties include, reviewing images or test results to check quality and adequate coverage of the areas needed for diagnoses, analyze diagnostic information to provide a summary of findings to doctors, and record findings and keep track of patients' records. Abdominal, Breast, Musculoskeletal, Pediatric, Obstetric and Gynecologic Sonographers are some of the different types of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers. To become a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer, one needs some formal education, such as an associate's degree or a postsecondary certificate and most employers prefer graduates of programs accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP). Diagnostic Medical Sonographer's average salary for the state of North Carolina is \$63,860 and \$69,650 for the nation.

Employment of a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer is projected to grow 26 % from 2014 to 2024.





## Network Engineering Students Demonstrate how data physically

moves through a network—the network engineering students had some hands on exercises in learning this past week. The first was working in pairs to build a patch cable. These are used to go from a computer to a wall jack or a switch. There are 4 pairs of color coded wires in the patch cable. These are separated and placed in a specific order, then inserted in to a jack and crimped. All have to be in place or the tester will show an error. Each pair was able to assemble their patch cable and take it home. The second exercise was more complicated and required communicating between members of the team and between teams. The class simulated wiring between rooms in a build-

ing. The teams had to agree on which ports to use and the wiring standard to follow. After they completed the wiring, they had to test the cables to make sure everything was correct. The pictures are from the first exercise In

## Addition, Computer Engineering students building their 1st

**computer.** Out of the 19 in the class, only 4 had assembled a PC. All the students were able to build and test a PC. Since the first of the year students

have learned all the basic parts of a PC and how they fit together and interact. Students were supplied a lab guide that provided the steps to putting the PC together and loading Windows. They have repeated the process twice. The goal of the first time was to get all the parts installed, according to the lab instructions, and get a functioning comput-

er. Once they were comfortable with the assembly of the PC, they disassembled the PCs and changed lab partners. Students then rebuilt the PC concentrating on clean wiring runs and the internal look of the
