

Counselors Help Students Prepare for Their Futures

On Tuesday, September 5th the School Counseling Department hosted a **Senior Night**. An extensive packet was given out and reviewed (also located on the CATA School Counseling Page, <u>Click Here</u>). During the presentation the counselors reviewed a Senior Timeline, Options after high school - Four Year School, Two Year School, Military, Work - College Applications, ACT & SAT, Recommendation Letters, Resumes, Financial Aid, and Scholarships.

Starting the week of September 11th the School Counselors began **individual senior meetings**. These purpose of these meetings was to discuss each senior's after high school plan. The meeting was steered by the senior based on their interests and questions. All of these meetings will be concluded by the end of September.

Financial Aid/FAFSA Night is scheduled for **Monday**, **October 16th at 6:30 pm**. The School Counselors encourage ALL seniors and parents to attend to learn the financial aid process and how to fill out the FAFSA Form!!!

Academy Classes and review Careers, Goals, and College Searches.

Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior Information:

Governor's School of North Carolina: This one-of-a-kind opportunity is open to JUNIORS (10th Graders are sometimes accepted in the performing/visual arts areas only). Governor's School is the oldest state-wide summer residential program for gifted high school students in North Carolina. Students in this intensive program take non-credit courses in a particular discipline for 5 1/2 weeks during the summer of 2018. Students interested in this awesome opportunity, please come see Ms. Goodwin in Guidance. DO THIS SOON! The deadline is Friday, October 13th. More information about the program can be found in this packet.

The PSAT will be given to all 10th and 11th graders on Wednesday, October 11th. Any 9th grader that is interested



Meet the Teachers

Mr. Buczkowski was a Digital Hardware Engineer for 17 years designing high speed multiprocessor computers. He has been teaching Technology to 6,7 and 8 graders for 11 years at the Lockport City school District Middle/Junior High schools. This is his first year teaching at CATA. He is dual certified in NY State in both Technology and Business/Marketing. He attended the University of Dayton and earned a BS in Bio-Engineering, the University of Buffalo and earned an MBA in Operations Management, and Buffalo State College, and earned his

agement, and Buffalo State College and earned his Teacher Certification. Major Projects in pre-engineering this year include learning Inventor Drawing in IED with design and building of an Automata Box, learning various manufacturing processes and integrating robotic process controls into a manufacturing simulation model, integrating the RAT Rod project into the course where ever possible, and involving robotics knowledge to better help robotics club. Planned field trips include taking the CIM classes to Vangurad Pai Li to observe and learn about ac-





tual manufacturing process controls at their factory in Monroe and looking for other authentic experiences to show our future engineers the possibilities to use their skills

Mr. Shear has been teaching for 18 years at the Union County Career Center, then continued when the school became CATA. He has certifications as an NCCR master trainer, and ETA International C.E.T. He attended CPCC, Southwestern NC, and NC A&T. Major Projects in pre-engineering this year EDD students will work on the electric bike.


October is National Bullying Prevention Month





Central Academy Dress Code

Dress code. The administration recognizes that the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States respects a student's right to choose his or her style of dress or appearance. However, if a student's dress or appearance is so unusual, inappropriate, or lacking in cleanliness that it disrupts the learning environment; the student may be required to change the offending dress or appearance. Clothing that attracts undue attention to the body's form or contour is inappropriate for school. Students are responsible, therefore, for exercising good judgment in dress and grooming. The following are guidelines for high school dress, but are not limited to these:

- Shorts, skirts, dresses, etc. must extend beyond a student's fingertips when the student is standing
 up straight.
- No holes are allowed above fingertip length.
- Shirts that show cleavage, stomachs, or bare backs violate dress code.
- No spaghetti/tank tops with shoulder straps less than 3-fingers wide.
- No mesh tops, see-through, cut-off shirts, halters, skintight clothes, or clothing of any type that exposes the torso, contains profane words, drug or alcohol advertising, sexual innuendoes, or other unacceptable graphics.
- Students must wear shoes.
- No hats or headwear worn inside buildings.
- No gang related clothing, paraphernalia, or tattoos.
- No sunglasses worn inside unless medically needed.
- Visible undergarments are prohibited at all times.

Students will be given the opportunity to change if they are out of dress code. If they choose not to or are not able to change, a parent will be required to bring an appropriate change of clothing.

Consequences for the above infraction may include up to Out-of-School Suspension.

Violation of classroom policies. Students shall follow any rules and regulations not addressed in this policy which are established by the administration or the classroom teacher.
