They had the opportunity to learn from other world-renowned and Grammy winning conductors, work with other Finalists, and get a taste of New York City. CONGRATULATIONS WHS DECA MEMBERS



Congratulations to the 52 WHS DECA members that went to Greensboro Feb. 23 to compete in the NC DECA State competition and all received proficiency in their events. 2400 NC students competed this year in 59 different events. WHS members competed in 18 events and won 10 Top Roleplay Medals, 10 Top Test Plaques, 13 Top Test medals, 17 Top Overall medals, 9 Trophies (DECA Glass) – 1st Place (4), 3rd Place (2), 4th Place (2), 6th Place (1). The 17 Top overall winners can advance to International Competition in Atlanta April 23rd. In the Virtual Events we had 6 students win 1st place (Accounting, Hotel and Sports & Entertainment). In addition, our chapter won Chapter of Distinction for extensive Program of Work and Silvia Petrikis won her election as NC State Officer for next year. IMPORTANT REMINDERS

We have been notified by the elementary school that a number of students are parking in the elementary school parking lot. Students are not permitted to park in the elementary or middle school parking lots. Unauthorized vehicles parked at the elementary or middle schools will be towed at the owners expense. **Students are also not to park in the church parking lot across from the school or on the streets in surrounding neighborhoods.**

Students are NOT to be dropped off or picked up in the surrounding neighborhoods. All student drop-offs in the morning and pick-ups at dismissal are to be done in the car rider line. **We also ask that**

all cars pull all the way down in the car rider line as directed by staff. This allows more students to access their rides at one time, thereby speeding up the pick-up process.


