Important Graduation Information

Graduation Rehearsal: Friday, June 3rd 12:00pm

All seniors participating in Commencement are required to attend rehearsal on Friday, June 3rd at 12:00pm. The check-in table will open at 11:15am by the gym doors near the student entrance of the school. All students will proceed to their line pods in preparation for practicing the processional. Additional information will be provided to seniors in the days prior to rehearsal.

Graduation: Monday, June 6th at 8:00am.

Weddington High School's Class of 2022 Commencement will be held on Monday, June 6th at 8:00am at the high school stadium. Seniors are expected to arrive and line up by 7:15am. Students may park in the student parking lot as early as 7:00am, check in at the table in the gym, and then proceed to their assigned pod for line up. We will begin the processional at 7:45am. It is extremely important that students arrive by 7:15am in order to ensure students are able to check in and be in line for the processional.

Dress code for students is business casual. Males should wear a collared shirt and females a dress, skirt, or dress pants. No flip-flops or high heels. Ladies should affix the white collar that comes with the graduation gown.

Graduation Tickets and Parking:

Each graduating senior will have 8 tickets to the ceremony. Each student must claim their tickets from the school website and distribute a QR code to their attendees. **Tickets will be available to claim beginning Monday, May 9th at 8:00am and will remain available to claim through Friday, June 3rd at 11:59pm**. Senior Collections:

Seniors will not be allowed to walk in the graduation ceremony if their school account has not been cleared. Our bookkeeper, Mrs. Tina Starnes, will be available following graduation practice to assist students with clearing any outstanding fees. It is extremely important that all seniors ensure that they have turned in all textbooks, library materials, Chromebook and charger, and any outstanding fees by the end of the day **Friday, May 27th**.

Senior Week

Senior week is a week at the end of May dedicated to helping seniors celebrate their accomplishments and create memories that will last a lifetime! Senior week will be May 16th - 20th this year. A schedule of events along with links to other documents pertaining to various events for the week was shared with seniors via Canvas and posted on social media earlier this week. The following are a couple time sensitive items that seniors must complete if they wish to participate:

Senior Banquet: This year's Senior Banquet will be held at Providence Country Club on Wednesday May 18th from 6pm-8pm. This event is for students only and will feature speakers, a video, and of course, food! There is a country club dress code. The cost to attend the Senior Banquet is \$30.00 which can be paid by clicking HERE. Seniors who wish to attend the Senior Banquet must purchase their ticket by Wednesday, May 11th at 3:00PM as Providence Country Club requires we give an advance head count. Seniors are encouraged to get their tickets while they are available. The menu selection will feature Asian cuisine.

Senior Class Field Trip: The Senior Class Field Trip to the White Water Center will take place on Thursday, May 19th. The due date to sign up for this trip was this past Wednesday as the White Water Center requires advance head count. Additional information regarding the trip will be sent to the Seniors who signed up in the coming weeks.

Senior Paint War: The annual senior paint war will take place on Friday, May 20th. The cost for the paint war is \$5.00 which can be paid <u>HERE</u>. Students must have a completed permission slip in order to participate in the paint war. The permission slip can be accessed <u>HERE</u>. The \$5 fee and permission slip are due by **Wednesday, May 18th at 3:00pm**. Students who do not complete one or both of these will not be able to participate.

Photos for the Senior video can now be submitted. All photos must be submitted via email following the steps below:

- Photos should be higher resolution and submitted electronically via email to whsseniorgrads22@gmail.com
- Photos can be from any age and can be individual or group pictures
- If a baby or young age photo is submitted, please use a photo editing software to type the students name on the photo in the way you would like it displayed
- All photos must be school appropriate or they will not be used
- · A maximum of 5 photos can be submitted per student

- All photos that are submitted may not make it into the video, however, we will do our best to include them all. Those that do not follow the above guidelines cannot be used.
- The deadline to submit pictures is May 10th so that prom photos may be included. This is a HARD deadline because we need time to download all photos and make the video prior to senior week.

SPRING EXAMS INFORMATION

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) TESTING:

AP Testing began on Monday May 2nd and will continue through the week of May 9th - 13th. All AP students received a handout with important information along with the schedule. The AP testing schedule is also attached below. Please encourage students to follow social media for any AP testing updates. The following are a few helpful testing day tips:

- Dress in layers- Gym/Media could be cold or warm
- Eat a healthy breakfast or lunch- nothing loaded in sugar to avoid a sugar crash
- Bring healthy filling snacks as all students will receive a 15 minute break between

- Get a good night's sleep: being well rested on your testing day will help you perform your best on the exam. Lack of sleep will make for a very long exam
- · Bring a calculator
- · Pencils and pens will be provided
- Cell phones will be collected: please make sure your phone can be identified quickly as some test groups are large and I-phones can all look identical. Avoid placing your credit cards and/or drivers license outside of your phone case
- · Leave smart watches at home as we will be required to collect all smart watches
- Do not bring any type of Bluetooth/wireless accessory
- Be on time- students will not be permitted to enter the test room late. If you have a morning test, please plan accordingly for traffic

Late Testing Policy

Any student who misses the AP exam must contact Mrs. Washington immediately via email. Please remember AP testing is **REQUIRED**. If a student does not participate in testing their overall grade will be lowered a letter grade according to UCPS policy. If a student misses the regular exam time, there will likely be a fee that the student will be responsible for.

SENIORS: Please remember that AP exam administration times are strict and we are bound to follow all College Board and AP Policies. Weddington High has never scheduled senior week during the regular administration of AP exams, however we have no control of late testing schedule conflicting with senior week activities. Please do your best to be present for all regular scheduled exams.

Testing will begin promptly at 8:15 am. Testing will conclude around 12:30/1:00 pm each day. No student can be released until all testing is complete and the testing session has officially ended for the day. Please be sure to bring your chromebook and chargers with you each day of testing.

Absences and Teacher Made Final Exam Exemptions

Absences have an impact on whether or not a student can be exempt from a teacher made final exam. The follow excerpt outlines the requirements for teacher made final exam exemptions as is found on page 22 of the 2021-2022 UCPS High School Student Handbook which can be accessed by clicking HERE.

High School students will not be required to take a teacher-made final exam in a course in the following situations:

- The student has an average of 90 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam **and** has no more than 2 unexcused absences in the class; or
- The student has an average of 80 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 1 unexcused absence in the class.

ATTENDANCE RECOVERY

Students in grades 9-12 who are absent for 8 periods or more in a semester long course or 15 in a yearlong course may fail the course. Yearlong courses are defined as courses which meet on a daily basis for the entire school year. Students with 8 or more unexcused absences will have the opportunity to make up the required seat time during Attendance Recovery.

Attendance Recovery is for students who have a chance to pass academically but are in danger of failing due to absences. Recovery will be aligned to the class/classes where the absences occurred. Recovered absences will not change the attendance record and excessive absences may impact other opportunities including the ability to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Students who are eligible for Attendance Recovery will receive notification from our attendance officer, Mrs. Bowen, on May 12, 2022 via student email and a letter will be mailed home. Parents will also receive notification through a Blackboard Connect message. Included in the communication to eligible students and their parents will be information regarding how much time the student needs to make-up through Attendance Recovery along with the process for signing up to attend.

Parents who have any questions after receiving their notification are asked to contact Mrs. Bowen by calling 704-296-6319.

Attendance Recovery will be offered at Weddington High School on the following dates and times:

- Saturday, May 14th from 8:00am 2:00pm (four possible sessions)
- Monday, May 16th through Friday, May 20th from 3:10pm to 6:10pm (each day would offer two 90 minute sessions)
- Saturday, May 21st from 8:00am 2:00pm (four possible sessions)

In total, there will be eighteen 90 minute sessions made available for attendance recovery.


