

School Counselor Accessibility

WHS students were recently reminded that their school counselors are available and eager to assist and support them with any academic, social, emotional needs that they may have. Students can always drop by the school counseling office to access a counselor, but they were also reminded that our counselors are consistently out and about in the school (hallways, cafeteria, etc.) during arrival time, lunchtime, and dismissal time. Please encourage your child to access one of our counselors if/when he/she has a need. Again, our school counselors are here to support the WHS journey of your child, and they are passionate about that mission.

Final Exam Schedule, Procedures, and Expectations

Final exams for the first semester of the 2019-2020 school year will occur during the week of January 13. Attached to this Warrior Weekly email message is an important document which provides the final exam schedule, procedures, and expectations.

Exam Week Review and Dismissal Procedures

All students are strongly encouraged to attend exam review sessions next week (Monday-review for period 2; Tuesday-review for period 3; Wednesday-review for period 4). Students who currently have an overall grade of A or B for the class are exempt from the review session if they choose. These students will be permitted to leave school at 12:30 p.m. on those review days. If a student is exempt and chooses to leave campus at 12:30, an early dismissal note signed by a parent must be turned into the main office at morning arrival time (prior to exam administrations). Please note that a parent may write a note covering early dismissal for more than one exemption day. We implore parents to support the academic success of your child by ensuring that he/she attends all required exam review session.

Schedule Change Requests

The process for students to request schedule changes for the second semester opens at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, January 10. The link to the schedule change request form and accompanying details about the process will be available under the Announcements tab of the WHS website. Additionally, there will be an informational PowerPoint available which provides details about the schedule change request process. Outstanding Fees

Please note that any student with any outstanding financial obligations (library books, laptop fees, etc.) or negative lunch balances will be impacted by restrictions on participation in special student events such as the Sadie Hawkins dance, Prom, and commencement exercises. Questions about lunch balances may be directed to our WHS Child Nutrition manager, Anne Watson, and lunch balances are to be paid in the cafeteria or through a student's online account. Questions about all other fees should be directed to our WHS bookkeeper, Tina Starnes, and such fees other than negative lunch balances should be paid through Mrs. Starnes.

Revised Tardy Policy

Students were recently informed of some revisions to the WHS student tardy policy. Beginning on January 22, 2020, student tardies may impact a student's ability to obtain a parking pass for the 2020-2021 school year. Some details of the policy include the following:

- *4 or more tardies will delay the student's sign-up time for a parking permit for the following school year.
- *8 or more tardies will result in the student not being able to obtain a parking permit in the 2020-2021 School year.

We appreciate your partnership in ensuring that your child gets to school on time each day. We strongly believe that this is important not only so that your child is present for all academic instruction, but more importantly, so that your child is developing strong habits of dependability for college, career, and life.

Parent Feedback on Naviance Desired

Union County Public Schools has collaborated with Hanover Research to conduct systematic and ongoing research in the form of program evaluations. These program evaluations will guide decision-making, provide a foundation upon which to develop and share best practices, and support program sustainability. The next program that UCPS has asked Hanover Research to evaluate is the use of the *Naviance* application at our middle and high schools. As a part of this collaboration, Hanover Research launched a survey on January 7, 2020 to gather as much stakeholder feedback as possible. The survey is scheduled to close on January 21, 2020.
