Our first newcomers' lunch marked the beginning of "the last" for several of our seniors and start of "the firsts" for many of our new students. The luncheon, a continuation of a tradition in the School Counseling office, hosts WHS seniors sharing words of wisdom with underclassmen while enjoying pizza and snacks. Similar themes shared by seniors across each lunch period were to "get involved" and that "grades count at every age."

Authentic engagement drives the work in the School Counseling office. Counselors, working to ensure authentic engagement for all students, actively participated in the club walk during lunches on Thursday. Students were encouraged to ask questions of the different club representatives identifying club fit and personal commitment to club mission and vision. Students had the opportunity to not only sign-up but to discuss the many ways each can be of service not only to the school but to the community at large.

PSAT

The PSAT will be offed to WHS students on October 16, 2019.

Sophomores are required to take the exam and are automatically registered for the test at no cost to the student.

Juniors are encouraged to test as junior year is the only year applicable to National Merit Scholarship. *Freshman* are encouraged to test if the student is enrolled in Math II or will be enrolled in the Spring.

PSAT scores are never submitted to colleges, and this is great practice for a timed test.

Freshman and Junior students will be charged a test fee of \$25 and can pay cash or checks made payable to WHS. Please submit payment in the School Counseling office to Mrs. Washington.

Absences from testing will be excused if a student is participating in testing.
