2nd GRADE NEWS

Reading - We will finish November with our nonfiction studies, learning all about Native Americans. Students will research and learn about a tribe, finishing with a poster presentation to the class.

Writing - We are working on a second "All About" book. Students will plan a book about a topic which they know a lot about to share with the class. Their book will include a cover, a table of contents, introduction, diagram, pictures, kinds of, how to, fun facts, and a glossary.

Math - We will continue to problem solve for word problems, learn about polygons, and measurement.

Social Studies - We are currently learning about communities. Students are designing a brochure and learning about workers in the community.

Science - We will begin a unit about sound after Thanksgiving.

Field Trip - The students will be attending a performance of 'Nutcracker' at Wingate University.



3RD GRADE NEWS

Reading - Students continue to read non-fiction and learn about non-fiction text features such as bold headings, bold vocabulary words, captions, diagrams, italicized words, and charts. In the classroom, the students will get to watch "March of the Penguins," and the teachers will read aloud "Mr. Popper's Penguins' so the students can compare and contrast fact vs. fiction.

Writing - The students will be choosing an animal from Antarctica to research. They will inform their audience (the class) by creating and presenting a poster.

Math - Unit 5: Students will apply their knowledge of place value to compare, order, and round numbers. They will use rounding to estimate sums and differences.

Social Studies - Unit 5: People and Economics - The students will learn about why people in a community depend on one another to make, buy, and sell goods and services.

Science - The students will learn about the sun, starts and planets as we explore the unit "Objects in the sky."



4th GRADE NEWS

The fourth graders are looking forward to our field trip to the Biltmore Estate in December! This trip supports our curriculum for Social Studies by allowing us to visit another region of the state and exploring a piece of the state's history.

In our daily classroom activities, we will be studying fractions in math, delving into non-fiction for writing and reading, and in Social Studies, we will study the period of early settlement and colonization in America. Please be certain you child has mastered multiplication facts! These facts will be vital throughout 4th grade and well into their future.

In December, we will also be welcoming Mrs. Brucia back from maternity leave, so that is exciting!
