KINDERGARTEN NEWS

We are all so excited to have such a great group of Kindergartners this year. We will spend the first week getting know our friends, our new school, and the rules and procedures of our classrooms.

Reading/Writing: We will enjoy stories about "Pete the Cat" and other back to school books. We will also learn to read and sing all about our color words. We will do a fun unit of study on apples.

Math: We will concentrate on counting numbers 1-5. We will play a lot of number concepts games using dice.





3rd GRADE NEWS

We would like to express how excited we are to have our returning Fairview students and our new students this year! We are looking forward to a great year. Our new students seem to be getting comfortable with the new school and are quickly forming new friendships! We would like to thank all the parents that sent in items on our wish list. We go through these supplies very quickly, and we cannot thank you wonderful parents enough. Below is some information on what your child will be learning in school the next several weeks.

Reading: Unit 1: Building a Reading Life

The students are learning skills and strategies that will enable them to practice the habits of a good reader as they explore a variety of literary genres. For example, readers choose "Just Right" books, readers read faster, stronger, and longer to build stamina, and readers make meaning from the text.

Writing: Unit 1: Launching the Writing Workshop and Narrative Writing

The students will review expected procedures and routines of the writing workshop while reviewing the process of writing personal narrative pieces. They will generate ideas about people they care about, places they have been, or things that they love. They will publish a story that involves one particular moment and stretch the story by adding details. Additionally, they will learn the writing process of prewriting, drafting, editing, revising, and publishing.

Math: Unit 1: Place Value

Our first six weeks, the students will learn place value, rounding whole numbers to the nearest 10 and 100, and fluently adding and subtracting within 1000. We would encourage parents to review these concepts with their child each night, as these are the building blocks for the units to come.

Social Studies:

Students are learning the qualities of good citizenship by identifying people who make a difference in the community and other social environments.

Science

The students will be learning about the skin and the bones of the human body.
