



Adobe Video Design - This course is a project-based video course that develops career and communication skills in video production using Adobe tools. This course is aligned to Adobe Premiere certification.

Health Science I - This course focuses on human anatomy, physiology and human body diseases and disorders, and biomedical therapies. Students will learn about health care careers within the context of human body systems.

Health Science II - Students expand their understanding of health care agencies, fundamentals of wellness, legal and ethical issues, concepts of teamwork, and effective communication. Students will learn health care skills, including current CPR and first aid training.

Nursing Fundamentals - designed for students interested in medical careers where personal care and basic nursing skills are used. It prepares students for the National Nurse Aide Assessment (NNAAP).


Hospitality & Tourism - Students acquire an understanding of the economic impact and marketing strategies for hospitality and tourism destinations.






