


Let your child make homework choices! Giving your child some choices about homework may reduce homework problems. Students have to do homework, but they should be able to decide:

- *Whether to do it in their room or at the kitchen table *Whether to do it right after school or after relaxing or exercising for a little while
- *Whether to do math first or start with reading
 *Whether to schedule one long homework session or
 two shorter sessions

Friendship

What you can do to promote friendship at home through reading:

*Friendship Chain-Cut pieces of paper into strips. On each strip, have a family member write down a way he or she is a good friend, and a way others are good friends to him or her. Link the strips by taping or stapling the ends together to make a Friendship Chain.

*Family and Friends Dinner-Organize a dinner where each family member invites a friend!

*Friendship Collage-Create a collage where you identify with your child admirable traits in his or her family members and friends.

Routines to Develop Your Child's Sense of Friendship:

*Read books around the theme of friendship with your child.

*Model reading behaviors for book clubs or with book buddies.

*Ask your child to share his or her favorite books.



W.I.C.O.R

WICOR is an acronym for strategies used in AVID classrooms. The letters stand for Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.

Reading is

- strategically gaining meaning, understanding, and knowledge from print and other media.
- It is purpose driven and interactive

Students who read:

- Understand text structures
- apply prior knowledge
- make connections to other texts, self, and world.
- make predictions
- ask questions
- create visual images as they read

Popular AVID Reading Strategies

- Marking-the-Text
- Writing-in-the-Margins
- Pause to Connect
- One-Page Report
