Helping your child with their homework

Kindness

What you can do to promote kindness at home:

- *An older sibling can become a reading buddy with a younger brother or sister.
- *Volunteer to do community service together such as reading to a sight-impaired resident of a nursing home.
- *Write a letter to a soldier.
- *Create a running list of kindness actions that you and your child can add to continually, and take action on one each week.
- **Find innovative ways to measure and reward acts of kindness in the home and in the community. Families can model kindness in everyday social interactions, and they can help children understand that kindness is more than being nice, it is also a genuine concern for others and a way of using reading, writing, listening, and speaking to improve the world in some way.

Components of AVID Elementary

AVID Elementary is designed to be embedded into the daily instruction of all elementary classrooms across entire grade levels to maintain schoolwide structures.

During each stage of learning, AVID Elementary incorporates:

- Student Success Skills - encompassing communication skills (e.g. listening, speaking, writing), self-advocacy skills, and study skills.
- Organizational Skills - both mental and physical; students are given organizational tools, as well as time management, goal-setting, and note-taking strategies.
- WICOR Lessons and L-WICOR Lessons - emphasize instruction on writing to learn, inquiry, collaboration, organization and reading to learn in all content areas.
- Partnerships - among students, classrooms, grade levels, schools, feeder patterns, families and communities.
