




Advancement Via Individual Determination

W.I.C.O.R

WICOR is an acronym for strategies used in AVID classrooms. The letters stand for Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.

Organization must be explicitly taught to all students. There are many methods of organizations and once students have mastered a particular method, they may find a different method that they prefer. But, it is essential that they learn at least one method well. Marshville focuses on the 3-ring binder as the best method of organization. This system will help prepare them for middle and high school. AVID uses multiple different processes, procedures, and tools to use the organization branch of WICOR, by managing materials and practicing using an agenda, prioritizing school work, engaging in mental preparation, and taking responsibility for ones school work and homework AVID students are expected to use their agendas and binders, which help them remember HW, important dates, and also organize our papers. Regular checks take place to ensure that students are using our organization tools. Parents should regularly check their child's AVID notebook to see important papers and logs.
