


PUT TIME IN THE CAR TO WORK FOR YOUR CHILD



This year MVES will celebrate Red Ribbon Week by participating in Spirit Week from October 22nd to October 26th.


- Monday 22nd Put a Cap on Drugs Wear your favorite hat!

W.I.C.O.R

WICOR is an acronym for strategies used in AVID classrooms. The letters stand for Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.

In AVID classrooms, students use a variety of writing styles: quick writes; Two/Three Column Notes and summaries; persuasive essays; personal statements; journals; reflections; exit tickets-just to name a few. These activities will prepare students for the types of writing that will be helpful in middle and high school and will help them be successful when they get to college.
