
Mascot

Valentine Crafts

Hey Eagles! It's Samora, and today I will be showing you some Valentine crafts you can make for the special holiday, **Valentine's Day!**

1. Glitter Valentine Rocks Materials: Small rocks, glitter, and glue.

1st Step- Gather small and smooth rocks; Then wash & dry the rocks.
2nd Step- Apply glue. You can use white Elmer's School Glue or Mod Podge. Just so you don't make a mess, you can squeeze a little bit of glue into a dish. Then, take a paintbrush, dip it into the glue {you do NOT need to dip a lot of glue onto the brush}, and try to make a heart on the rock with the paintbrush as best as you can {if your heart isn't perfect, don't worry because, this is just for fun!}

<u>3rd Step</u>- Sprinkle the glitter onto the rock. You can use whatever color you want. But between now & the next step,DO NOT let this dry!

<u>4th Step</u> - Shake the glitter off. No glitter should come off the heart, since there is glue on top.

<u>5th Step</u> - Finally, you can now admire your rocks or, you can give them to your special Valentine!

2. It's Raining Hearts

Materials: empty a cardboard cereal box, white tissue paper squares, school glue, red construction paper, string, scissors, and tape.



1st Step- Start by cutting a cloud shape out of an empty cereal box. Put school glue {which is basically a glue recommended by teachers} on one section at a time of the cloud and cover it with crumpled white tissue paper squares. Continue until the entire cloud is covered in the crumpled tissue paper squares.

2nd Step- Now, after the glue has set, tape 5 strands of string or yarn to the back of the cloud. You would want them to be about 12 in. long each. For the next step, you will need to leave the cloud face down, so the side of the cloud that the string is taped on should be facing up.

<u>3rd & 4th Step</u>- Add another layer of tissue paper over the tape. Then, cut hearts out of red construction paper. Make them whatever size you'd like. After, take a heart, place it underneath the string and place a piece of tape over the string to hold the heart in place.

<u>5th Step</u>- After you are finished taping hearts to all of the different strings, turn it over to reveal your gorgeous cloud raining hearts.

named Carter G. Woodson invented the Association for the Study of African American life and history, also known as ASALH. This association was founded on February 12th, 1909. His partner in crime was a minister named Jesse E. Moorland. President Gerald Ford made the holiday official in 1976.
