

What exactly is the Robotics I course, you ask? Robotics I provides a comprehensive study of programming, engineering and other STEM concepts. These core concepts are delivered through relevant activities and projects using robotics as a vehicle to convey the principles of programming and engineering. Project-based learning is an essential learning strategy in Robotics I as it uses authentic activities, scenarios and in-class competitions as a final project.

PRHS Career Spotlight ~ Robotics Engineer

Robotics Engineers design and create robots and robotic systems, with a concentration in at least one of three skill areas; computer aided drafting & design, building robots, or research and development. Computer aided drafting & design uses modeling programs such as AutoCAD, Blender, Innovator, and SolidWorks to design plans and schematics. The building of the robots allows robotics engineers to work in the hands-on construction of the robots. While the research and development of the robots, is developing modifications and redesigning when needed. The average salary for a Robotics Engineer in North Carolina is \$94,940 and \$97,250 for the nation.


2019 - 2020 CTE Internship



Pre-Apprenticeship Program Overview

- Student takes moming classes at High School while afternoon is split between classes at SPCC and working at Greiner Bio-One, or other partner company.
- Student is paid for approximately 20 hours per week which is a combination of training, attending classes and work.
- Fall Classes at SPEC would begin Mid-August, 2019
- Students receive High School Credit for their Community College Courses. Provides a potential opportunity to be selected for Registered Apprenticeship Program
- Provides hands on training to develop technical skills.

Pre-Apprenticeship Program Qualifications

- Rising High School Senior.
- Eurnert GPK must be at least a 2.5. Student must have a minimum 2.8. GPK at Graduation to be considered for the Beginteed Appendiceship Program.
- Sofficient High School Gredits to allow Community College courses in Sector schedule.
- Be able to attend a 3-4 week summer program beginning on June 10, 2019 through June 28, 2019.

- Completion of the Pre-Apprenticeship program allows students opportunity take selected into the Engletered Appendiceship program for Graner Bio-One, or other partner companies.
- Apprenticeship Program is a Four Year, 8.000 hour program which allows candidates to graduate with an AAS technology degree from SECC.
- It is a Dual Training system, go ta school and work. The hours of work and education will vary from remember to remember; the employee will be paid 40 hours per work to indude work time and education time.
