

Senior Information

Dear Class of 2019,

We are very proud of every one of you. For the remainder of this spring semester we hope you will enjoy your time with your friends, family, and teachers while maintaining high academic performance. We hope you will have fond memories of PRHS and of all the people here. Congratulations on making it to this point in your academic career. We would like to provide you some updated information for your senior year. We ask that you review the entire letter with your family. We are excited about the remainder of your senior year and want to be sure you know all necessary information.

Caps and Gowns: Were delivered on Monday 4/15 during lunches. See the office staff if you did not pick up your order. **Individual Cap and Gown pictures:** Thursday 4/18 – the sign up link was emailed to all seniors at the start of this week. Please be on time to your appointment.

Graduation: The ceremony is on Saturday, June 8, 2019 at 4:00 PM at the Cabarrus Arena (4751 NC Highway 49 Concord, North Carolina 28025). Please arrive no later than 3:00pm to line up. Please be aware of traffic and plan accordingly to arrive on time. Due to limited parking we urge you to drive with your parents. A map and directions will be provided for you at a later date.

Attire: Students are expected to dress appropriately since this is a dignified ceremony. Students at PRHS are only permitted to wear PRHS-issued cords, medallions, and cap and gown. No graduation regalia may be altered in any way.

Senior Academic Signings: Our school will continue with the tradition of seniors signing for their plans for college, military, or career (on 5/21 11:30 am – see above). Signings will also include scholarship recognitions and Department Awards as warranted. All senior parents are invited to attend. Parents of those receiving awards will receive a separate notification.

Graduation Practice: Practice is on Tuesday 5/21 at 8:00 am in the gym. ALL Seniors must attend if you plan to participate in graduation. If you normally flex, you must be here at school for this practice. It is your responsibility to schedule any college functions and work schedules around final exams, graduation practice, and graduation itself. You do <u>not</u> wear your cap and gown to practice.

Senior CLASS of 2019 Cap and Gown Picture: Thursday May 23rd 8:15 am. You must have your cap and gown to be in the picture (we strongly recommend that you do NOT bring your tassel as it is easy to lose and we do not have replacements). **Yearbooks:** Our plan is to issue yearbooks to seniors during Senior Week. More information to follow.

Graduation Speeches: Information on auditions will be provided over the school announcement system. Please pay attention for announcements.

Past due fees: Past due fees must be paid before students may participate in Graduation. Please make all payments at the school with the bookkeeper. Any unpaid fee owed to the school or school system must be paid prior to receiving tickets for graduation. **Tickets:** Tickets will be on sale starting 5/21 after the Academic Signing Ceremony. Tickets will continue to be sold in the main office through June 5th during normal office hours. Each senior will receive five (5) free tickets with the opportunity to buy extra tickets at \$10.00 a ticket until we reach venue capacity.

Everyone (including children) must have a ticket to enter the arena.

Students will not receive their free tickets until after graduation practice.

Extra Information about graduation day:

- · Cabarrus Arena will have police officers and security at the graduation event. Please remind your guests that noisemakers are not permitted in the arena. Guests to the ceremony should plan on arriving 30 minutes to an hour in advance to allow for traffic. Graduates must arrive by 3:00 pm.
- · Students should not bring any valuables with them, including phones, into the arena, as there will be no place for them to store valuables. Please leave them with your parents.
- · A professional photographer will take pictures of the graduates receiving their diploma. Students will receive information on how to order the pictures in their Senior Envelope that they get after the ceremony.
- At the end of the graduation ceremony all seniors will proceed out of the arena and will use the arena tunnels to exit to the back of the arena where they will receive their actual diploma, final transcript, picture information, and other important items. An official transcript in a sealed envelope will be in the packet. It is <u>your</u> responsibility to mail it to your college. The school does not mail the final transcript it is provided to you and it is your responsibility to mail after graduation.
- Guests and graduates will not be able to stay inside the arena for pictures and our school must exit the arena parking areas 30 minutes after the ceremony concludes.

Seniors, remember that graduating from high school is dependent upon earning the number and type of credits needed to earn a diploma. Please continue to attend to your classes and finish your high school career strong! Continue to make yourself, your family, and your school proud!

School Counseling

**Are you interested in attending or learning about Historically Black Colleges & Universities?

Campus Connections is an outside program that works with high school students in grades 10 and 11 to increase their awareness of the educational and cultural opportunities available to them at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). Campus Connections will have an information meeting on May 20th during Pirate Prep in the Media Center. Interested 10th & 11th grade students must sign up by 5/17 to attend at the following link: shorturl.at/dwzFI.

**Counselors are still meeting one-on-one with all Pirates to go over their course requests for 2019-20. Counselors have used these meetings to select courses but also engage in conversations about post-graduate plans and goals, career pathways, UCPS academies, graduation requirements, and more. Students who were absent on the day their 2nd block class came to Counseling or who did not put in their own requests before the deadline, will get meetings with counselors. Counselors spent 2 full days this week meeting with 8th graders on their course requests. Parents, your student will bring home their list of requests and ask you to approve it with a signature. Please note any changes you want on the list of courses.

After the meetings and the parent signatures, no further changes will be made to course requests.

- **For families making decisions about colleges and financial aid packages, here is a helpful article.
- **Parents, some students don't truly focus on life after high school until graduation is right in front of them. If your student is undecided, please have them reach out to their school counselor. We can help with applications to community college, with identifying potential trades, connecting with some local employers, and laying a longer term plan for attending a 4-year college. Whatever direction you student chooses, counselors are here to support.

Online Classes

If your child is interested in online courses for summer or next school year applications are now available in the counseling office. Spaces for online classes are limited. Application deadline is May 10th. As students consider summer classes please know the courses are very intensive and demand 3-4 hours per week day of work. The classes also require access to wifi. In the past students have been surprised by the demands of summer courses and have struggled. Families planning on vacations during the course should plan on their students continuing to dedicate 3-4 hours per day and have reliable wifi.



Computer Programmers create, modify, and test the code, forms, and script that allow computer applications to run. They must have the knowledge of circuit boards, processors, chips, electronic equipment, and computer hardware and software, including applications and programming. Computer Programmers also have the knowledge of practical application of engineering science technology, arithmetic, algebra, geometry, calculus, statistics, etc. The average salary for a Computer Programmer in North Carolina is \$87,900 and \$82,240 for the nation.
