Remember to be at school to learn. If you are a student who is in a course with a Teacher-made exam please know the exam exemption policy: High School students will not be required to take a teacher-made final exam in a course in the following situations:

- The student has an average of 90 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 2 unexcused absences in the class; or
- The student has an average of 80 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 1 unexcused absence in the class.

Students are expected to take all other assessments given at the school.

#### Summer Leadership

Students looking for summer opportunities? Check out the NC Community Development Initiative's **Summer Youth Leadership Program**. Applications are due April 8. This is a great opportunity for any student looking to sharpen leadership skills and also demonstrate a commitment to leadership on college applications. The program comes with a \$750 stipend. Many similar programs charge the student to participate. Check it out!

PRHS just held its first Kindness Week. Our amazing Student Council organized and implemented the events. The students fully embraced the concept. Activities included a "Random Acts of Kindness" Day where students acknowledged gestures of kindness with a smiley sticker, a community services project (from out Pirate community to the outside community) of gathering donated teddy bears to deliver to children at Levine Children's Hospital, and a yellow out day when the school wore yellow to celebrate kindness.

#### **Class Registration**

Counselors continue to see 9-11<sup>th</sup> graders in one-on-one meetings to review the student's course selections. Counselors and students are having good discussions about career goals, college plans, course pathways, and all that goes into a thoughtful selection of courses. Parents are asked to approve their student's course selection. After his or her meeting with the counselor, the student will bring home a list of selected courses for a parent/guardian to approve with a signature. Remember – we build our master schedule based on student course requests. If a student gets a requested class on his or her schedule, the schedule will not be changed in the fall. These one-on-one meetings will continue through April.

Counselors will visit 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms today to begin the registration process with our rising 9<sup>th</sup> graders. We will also meet individually with each student to review their courses requests and a parent/guardian will be asked to approve the selections with a signature.

Some of our students did not make course selections in Powerschool before the deadline. They are now locked out and cannot make selections. Counselors will work with those students at the end of our registration process. These students will **not** be at any disadvantage in getting their preferred classes.

#### College and Career Promise

Students who are **currently** enrolled in Career and College Promise at SPCC will be meeting with Ms. Davison next week to discuss future classes. Students new to CCP will meet with Ms. Davison at a later date.

#### Online Classes

If your child are Interested in online courses for summer or next school year applications are now available in the counseling office. Spaces for online classes are limited. Application deadline is May 10th. As students consider summer classes please know the courses are very intensive and demand 3-4 hours per week day of work. The classes also require access to wifi. In the past students have been surprised by the demands of summer courses and have struggled. Families planning on vacations during the course should plan on their students continuing to dedicate 3-4 hours per day and have reliable wifi.



The Veterinary Assisting academy offered at Porter Ridge provides students who show an interest in learning about veterinary medicine an opportunity to receive exposure and skills related to animal care. Students are exposed to proper veterinary practice management and client relations, pharmacy and laboratory procedure, advanced animal care, and surgical/radiological procedures.

Students will be prepared and have the opportunity to earn their Certified Veterinary Assistant Level I certification by sitting for the Certified Veterinary Assistant Level I exam and fulfilling 500 hours of hands on training working with live animals.
